Reflections on the weekend Scriptures Genesis 12:1–4a; Psalm 33; 2 Timothy 1:8b–10; Matthew 17:1–9

As God's call challenged Abram to "go forth" (Genesis 12:1) from a comfortable past, trusting in the future God promised, so Jesus' transfiguration summons Peter, James, and John to "go forth" from preconceived notions of a glorious Messiahship (and their share in that glory) to a new vision of Jesus' mission and theirs. True, the Transfiguration reveals Jesus as fulfilling law (Moses) and prophets (Elijah), but no flaming chariot will deliver Jesus from suffering. Peter, James, and John glimpse Jesus' transfigured glory, but soon will witness Jesus' abject agony. Earlier, they could not bear Jesus' prediction of that suffering, but now from the cloud a voice commands them: "Listen!" (Matthew 17:5).

If we do listen to Jesus, no tents need be built. Moses, Elijah, cloud, and voice all recede into history. Jesus alone remains, unassumingly present in Word, Eucharist, neighbor. But to eyes of faith, Jesus is the living "Tent of Meeting;" "Emmanuel, God-with-us," as the angel foretold before his birth; "with you always," as Jesus himself promises in the last verse of Matthew's Gospel (28:20).

For us too, "going forth" with Jesus requires that we "come down from the mountain," leaving Transfiguration experiences behind, cheerfully embracing the discipleship Jesus preached in the Sermon on the Mount those Sundays before Lent: To comfort the afflicted, work for peace, love neighbor and enemy, initiate reconciliation, bear witness in poverty of spirit and purity of heart, suffering persecution when necessary; to "bear [our] share of hardship" required by the gospel of the One who "destroyed death and brought [us] life and immortality" (2 Timothy 1:8, 10).

Question of the Week

How is Christ's call to be "transfigured" calling me to "go forth" this Lent from my present (comfortable) values and lifestyle, priorities, and preferences?
