Print and cut out the letter templates.


Adhere the letters to the bottom of the chocolate kiss candies with glue or tape.

Silver Bells

Materials:

Egg Carton Cups (paper not foam)

Aluminum Foil or Washable Silver Finger Paint

String

Small Jingle Bells (optional)



Instructions:

Cut several egg carton cups apart.

Help your child to cover with foil or to paint with silver finger paint.

Once dry, poke a hole through each and string onto the string. Tie a knot to secure.

If desired tie or glue a small jingle bell into each one.

These are fun to string together and hang as a decoration!

Ornament Sun Catcher

Materials:

Ornament Template:

Clear Contact Paper

Tissue Paper (any Color)

Instructions:

Print ornament template.

Give your child a peeled piece of clear contact paper, with the adhesive side facing up.

Let them tear up the tissue paper and cover the contact paper with it.

Once they are finished put a second piece of contact paper, adhesive side down on top of the first.

Press firmly, to press out any air bubbles.

Cut the contact paper into the shape of the ornament.

Display in a window!

Handprint Wreath

Materials:

Paper Plate or Piece of Cardboard

Green Construction Paper

Pen or Pencil

Safety Scissors (if your child will help cut)

Glue or Glue Stick



Instructions:

Cut the inside out of the paper plate (leaving a wreath shape) or trace a circle onto the piece of card board, cut out, trace a smaller circle inside the larger one and cut out. (I use a dinner plate and a salad plate).

Help your child to trace their hands onto the green construction paper. Cut out (or help your child to cut out) several hand prints (the exact number will depend on the size of your wreath – but the more the better!)

Help your child to glue them around the paper plate or cardboard to create their wreath!

Guess What's In the Stocking?

Materials:

Stocking or Sock

Objects to Hide in the Stocking: (examples)

Apple or Carrot
Block
Action Figure or Doll
Stuffed Animal
Piece of Sandpaper
Spoon



Instructions:

Have your child close their eyes while you hide an object in the stocking. Help your child feel what is in the stocking without taking it out. Can they guess what the object is?

Help them to use descriptive words to describe what they feel, hear or smell.

Pull out the object and see if they're correct!!

Christmas Snow

Globe

Materials:

Kid-Sized Water Bottle (empty)

Clear Karo (corn) Syrup

Holiday Shiny Confetti Pieces

Glue



Instructions:

Help your child to remove the label and clean the outside of the water bottle.

Place shiny confetti pieces inside the empty bottle.

Fill bottle carefully with Karo syrup (amount will depend on the exact size of the water bottle).

Place glue on the inside of the bottle top and twist on firmly. Let dry.

Let your child tip the bottle up and down until the confetti begins to move within the corn syrup.

** Make sure the lid is glued on tightly!! Also, this is best saved as an "inside toy" meaning if you drop it off of the balcony or deck onto the pavement below it will make a mess!!!

Pine Cone Ornament

Materials:

Pinecone

Glue

Glitter

Foam Brush or Small Paintbrush

String



Instructions:

Help your child to cover the pinecone with glue.

Pour the glitter into a small pie plate or other container.

Roll the pinecone in the glitter until it is well coated.

Let dry.

Shake off excess glitter.

Tie the string to the top of the pinecone to create an ornament!

Play Dough

Materials:

Sauce Pan

1 C. All Purpose Flour

1/4 C. Salt

1 tsp. Cream of Tartar

1 C. Water



A Few Drops of Peppermint Extract (optional – I don't recommend using if your child is still putting non-edible things in their mouth)

1 Tbsp. Oil

Red Food Coloring

Instructions:

Combine in saucepan: flour, salt and cream of tartar.

Add and whisk until smooth: water and oil.

Cook over medium heat until nearly play dough is nearly set. Add peppermint extract.

Stir until extract is blended, then remove and knead when cool. Divide the dough in half and add red food coloring to one half of the mixture.

Once completely cool, show your child how to make two "ropes" of play dough and twist them together to make a "candy cane."

Let your child make their own creation.

Store in Ziploc bag or air tight container, if desired.





Print and cut out wreath worksheet.


Help your child to peel and place the correct number of foil stars onto each wreath.

Bend the top of the beaded pipe cleaner in order to form a "candy cane."

Take your child with you to mail the letter, and talk about how happy the recipient will be to get it in the mail!






Red and Green Fruit Kabobs

Ice Cream Cone Christmas Tree

Ingredients:

Ice Cream Cone (sugar cone)

Frosting

Green Food Coloring

Decorations: (examples)

Cereal

Small Candies

Chocolate Chips (or other colored "chips")

Dried fruits

Instructions:

Add several drops of green food coloring to the frosting. Stir to combine the colors.

Help your child to carefully (so the cone doesn't break) cover the cone with frosting.

Place the cone upside down on a plate.

Let your child decorate it using any small edible decorations you have!



Peppermint Air Freshener

Materials:

Small Paper or Clear Plastic Cups or Baby Food Jars

4 pkgs. Unflavored Gelatin

A Few Drops of Peppermint Extract

Green Food Coloring (optional)

1 Cup Boiling Water

1 Cup Ice Water

Instructions:



Adults Only: Combine boiling water with unflavored gelatin. Stir until dissolved.

Add Ice water and stir.

Carefully help your child to add peppermint extract and food coloring.

Once it cools a little pour it into cups, or baby food jars.

You can also add glitter or small pieces of peppermint if you wish!

As the gelatin solidifies you will have an air freshener!
