Today we visit <u>Pergamum</u>. The ruins lie to the north and west of the modern city of Bergama. Pergamum was the capital city of the province. It had a great library of 200,00 volumes. The Acropolis was built on a hill and there were many temples including one to Asceleplos the god of healing.

The 'throne of Satan' in Revelation 2:13 is thought to be the great altar to Zeus, but others think it might be the whole hill with the temples in contrast to 'the mountain of the Lord'.
