Reflections on the weekend Scriptures Ezekiel 2:2-5; Psalm 123; 2 Corinthians 12:7-10; Mark 6:1-6

In Mark's Gospel, faith is a prerequisite for healing. Jesus does not heal to make people believe; he heals those whose faith is strong. Last week Jesus healed two people whose faith was strong. "Your faith has saved you," Jesus tells the woman who had been ill for twelve years (Mark 5:34). But in today's Gospel, "he was not able to perform any mighty deed" among his own kin because of "their lack of faith" (Mark 6:5-6). Our faith aids our receptivity to God's grace.

Saint Paul found wisdom in the way he faced challenges. He begged the Lord to remove "a thorn in the flesh," but accepted God's grace as a response. He realized that the work he did despite his difficulty revealed the power of Christ more than work he could do easily. In his weakness, the strength of God was made manifest.

Sometimes the real reason a prophet is rejected is because the people find the message to be too challenging. God warned Ezekiel that the people would be "obstinate of heart." Ezekiel would be telling them that it was due to their sins that they were living in exile and that Jerusalem would soon be destroyed. Certainly this was not what they would want to hear. Mark does not tell us what Jesus said in the synagogue, but Luke does: "he has anointed me to bring glad tidings to the poor" (Luke 4:18). Perhaps most of those in attendance felt themselves better than "the poor" and did not appreciate that they were excluded from the "glad tidings."

Ouestion of the Week

How do I respond when someone is critical of me? Do I search myself to find my failings or do I merely look for reasons to reject their criticism?

I would hope that we all

seek out God each day and becoming more faith-filled, encounter him with regularity in the fibre of everyday living. Jesus rewards faith with healing....may each of us, in such need of healing, look to Jesus in faith and be rewarded. God bless Fr. Roger
