

# MCCA IS NOW 50 YEARS OLD

Two brothers, Marv and Don Van Wieren, along with brother-in-law Mike Stoel, had seen a film about Pastor Jose Acosta in Valle de Guadalupe, Baja. They often went fishing in Ensenada and, being touched by this film, decided to find this pastor during one of their trips to Ensenada. Needless to say, they began taking food and supplies to the church run by Pastor Acosta. On one of these trips Bud De Young brought a box of frozen chicken. When he delivered it, Pastor Jose acted like he was expecting it. When asked about this, his answer was, "I knew you were coming. I prayed about this and the Lord assured me they would be here. I promised the men that are pouring a new concrete floor in the church there would be a chicken dinner for them when the floor was done." God had answered his prayer.

In 1964 six men, Ray Zimmer, Don Van Wieren, Mike Stoel, Scott Coverdale, Jerry Hamill, and Art Cooper, set the wheels in motion to do things more "efficiently," going with two or three vehicles a month, sometimes multiple trips in a month. In 1966 a non-profit corporation was formed, Mexican Christian Children's Plan. The name was changed to Mexican Christian Children's Aid in 1973. The next place to receive

support was Rose Park, an orphanage in Tijuana. Juan and Joan Sandoval, recent graduates of La Puente Bible College, went to Tijuana to save souls. These souls were very young, some babies literally lying in the gutter. Before long, Rose Park had thirty children to care for full time. Soon, others heard of the help available from MCCA and the number of ministries served grew. In the 60's MCCA delivered to a few places along a single route. In 1986 there were 25 ministries serviced by two routes, the long run to

just north of Ensenada and the short run from Tijuana to Tecate. By the late 90's the number had grown to 12 to 15 trucks a month delivering 25 tons of food to 45 ministries. As the need grew, the Lord continued to provide workers and donations so MCCA could grow as well.

Today there are 6 different "runs" that are made every month that deliver goods to 58 ministries. The longer trips will cover 450 miles in a day, while the shortest trip is still around 300 miles. The map pictured is an example of how far the Lord has called us to travel in His name for MCCA. The stars on the map represent a sampling of the places we go. There is not enough room to include them all.

Will MCCA continue to grow? Can we continue to help meet the needs of children that need aid? Only God knows what the future holds. We have many challenges to overcome in the immediate and long-term direction of MCCA. As we've done in the past, we'll put our trust in the Lord

For now, though, we want to praise God for His work in Mexico through MCCA for the past 50 years.

Mexican Christian Children's Aid is a charitable corporation founded in 1964 by a group of Christian businesspersons concerned over the sharp contrast between the wasteful affluence of U.S. society and the abject poverty found so close to our borders. MCCA is dedicated to helping needy children in Baja California, Mexico, by providing food and other assistance to local Christian organizations. At least <u>97%</u> of all funds are used for food, Bibles, and other aid provided directly to orphanages and other Christian organizations in Mexico.
