# Grant received for Story Time

"The Board of Directors of Hardy County Community Foundation is pleased to announce a \$681 grant from the Hardy County Founding Fund to support the Wardensville Lions Club's Story Time project at the Wardensville Public Library." This statement begins a letter received from Amy Pancake, Affiliate Director of the Hardy County Community Foundation. Patty Austin applied for the grant on behalf of the club to help with the costs for snacks and crafts for the children who come to Story Time. The foundation is hoping that Wardensville's Story Time may be shared with other organizations so that the program may be duplicated in other places.



Each Thursday at 10:00, children age 10 and younger come to the library for an hour to enjoy books read by special guests, songs, crafts, snacks, dances, games, and friendship. There is a theme for each week such as farms, dogs, seashells and the beach, the post office, the library, dinosaurs, and monkeys.

The attendance averages around 10 children per week, with mothers and

grandmothers enjoying visiting and sharing in the Story Time activities. Recent activities include a scavenger hunt in the library, excavating for dinosaurs, planting flowers in hand decorated pots, writing letters to mail to special people, and making seashell picture frames, sleepover doll blankets, monkey and puppy puppets.



It's hard to tell who is having more fun – the children or the leaders! Story Time has many benefits, and the leaders are grateful for the foundation's confidence in the program and the financial help. Story Time adults include librarians Pat Harmon and Marlene Collins, as well as Ann Funkhouser, Ann Heishman, Lorrie Krautwurst, Aggie Mason, Alanna McGuinn, Esther Parker, and Patty Austin.



### Quartets on Parade - 2014



The search for entertainers for Quartets on Parade – 2014 has already begun and I believe it has just ended. I have a commitment from the Chorus of the Chesapeake from Dundalk, Maryland to sing on our 2014 show. The chorus manager expressed an interest in performing for us and there was excitement in his voice when he told me they would come. It was this chorus that inspired me to join Barbershop in 1974. I am very excited to be able to have this chorus perform on our show. I know they will provide an exceptional performance.

In 1961 and 1971 the Chorus earned the title, "International Chorus Champions" and they continue to be a top notch chorus under the direction of Rick Taylor. Rick continues to take the chorus to international competition; this year singing in Toronto, Canada. When the chorus travels to Wardensville they will come by bus bringing about 60 men to our stage. The Chorus of the Chesapeake will bring a new level of performance and excitement to the Capon Valley.

Our show date for 2014 will be April 12<sup>th</sup> which is two weeks earlier than usual.
