Reflections on the weekend Scriptures

Ezekiel 17:22–24; Psalm 92; 2 Corinthians 5:6–10; Mark 4:35-41

We who hear Mark's Gospel so many centuries later already know that "truly this man was the Son of God" (Mark 15:39). Nevertheless, the long succession of "green Sundays" stretching until Advent confronts us anew with the question that each Christian community, each individual Christian faces continually throughout life, the question that concludes today's Gospel: "*Who is this?*"

Since Mark's Gospel is so brief, Year B's Lectionary detours for five Sundays into John's Gospel, Chapter 6, Jesus' "Bread of Life Discourse." Therefore, Year B's combination of Mark and John 6 suggests that we find our answer to that recurring "Who is this?" in Jesus' cross *and* Jesus' gift of the Eucharist.

For today's disciples, traveling in a boat that seems unequal to the weather it faces—us, in the Church, in the world—what a comforting reminder that today's Eucharist is our continually renewed participation in Jesus' paschal mystery.

Question of the Week

As we pass through all of the uncertainties of life, where do we place our faith? Where do we place our reliance?
