## **Reflections on the weekend Scriptures** Wisdom 2:12, 17–20; Psalm 54; James 3:16–4:3; Mark 9:30–37

• What a vivid image James uses of the hearts of the rich being fattened for slaughter! Normally one thinks of animals being fattened for slaughter—animals that will provide food on our plates. But James is talking about people who foolishly and greedily hoard their wealth. Their hearts are not animated by a desire to share with those in need. In fact, they are impoverishing the very people who do the work to increase their profit. This leaves their hearts as bloated as their wallets. Their wealth will rot away. Their wealth is not eligible for eternal life.

• God does not diminish anyone's own gifts when spreading those gifts among a wider population. Did Moses's ability to prophesy weaken after dozens of elders received the same ability? No. Were Jesus'exorcisms less effective because others were doing the same thing in his name? Of course not. God's grace is not a limited resource that can only stretch so far. We cannot put a limit on the gifts God gives.

• Moses's wish that ends the first reading—"Would that the LORD might bestow his spirit on them all!"—does not go unfulfilled (Numbers 11:29). The Lord has indeed bestowed the Holy Spirit on us all. In baptism we all received exactly what Moses hoped for. We all have the ability to prophesy—to speak the word of God to those we encounter. From time to time we need to be reminded of that gift—and that duty. We are obligated by the presence of the Holy Spirit within us to preach hope to the hopeless and conversion to those whose hearts are in the wrong place.

### **Question of the Week**

How do I put too much faith in those impermanent things that bring me wealth and comfort? How can I express the Spirit who I received in baptism to others?

Generosity. Our reading from the Letter of St. James could not really be more blunt as we look at the topic of generosity and greed. In the early church, people just did not decide, as we do today, to follow Christ. Their actions had to accompany their decision. They sold all and placed all of their money at the feet of the Apostles who they trusted to do what was best with what was received. There is even an account in the Acts of the Apostles of a couple "trying to short change" their gift, which resulted in their immediate death. Why is it now that so few give generously, not only here, but in other charities as well? St. James hits it on the head when he says that you cannot take your wealth with you, so why do people try? I think the first problem is that people seem to think they will live forever (as attested to by St. Ann's Cemetery) or that they received the welth and it belongs to them (me) remember the story of Lazarus and the rich man, who died and was burried. All this leads to the realization that God expects us all to be generous with our assets in life giving not the bare tiny amount we can, but with a giving and loving spirit, not regreting that we give but rejoicing that our lives have been so greatly blessed that we can share a portion in return. Jesus always told us it is better to give in life, especially considering the precarious place our parish exists in from week to week. Can we not take the words from St. James to heart and really give generously? God bless Fr. Roger
