Reflections on the weekend Scriptures Isaiah 5:1–7; Psalm 80; Philippians 4:6–9; Matthew 21:33–43

Recognize anyone in today's very pointed parable? Isaiah and the psalm response may tempt us to think we've clearly identified the culprits. The servants are an easy call: the endless succession of mistreated prophets whose messages were rejected. The son, "thrown out of the vineyard and killed," is even more obvious (cf. Matthew 21:39). And Jesus' conclusion seems to clinch it, the vineyard changing hands: unfaithful Israel succeeded by the faithful Church—us—right?

Not so fast! The Lectionary clips off the Gospel's conclusion: "When the chief priests and the Pharisees heard his parables, they knew that he was speaking about them" precisely in order to challenge us to understand that we are Jesus' audience (Matthew 21:45)! The danger in hearing parables from our comfortable distance is that we instinctively let ourselves off the hook by identifying the objects of Jesus' criticism as anyone but ourselves. Humility, on the other hand, suggests that the Church now, more than Israel then, needs to hear this story of barren vines and closed hearts, and take that message home for a personal examination of conscience, especially during Respect Life month.

As harvest time draws near, in nature and for each of us in judgment, we'd best examine just how fruitful our own corner of the vineyard is. If God's peace is standing "guard over my heart and mind in Christ Jesus," as Paul advises, then I ought to "have no anxiety at all," or at least so little that I am free to love, to work, and to tend the vineyard to fruitfulness (cf. Philippians 4:7, 6).

Question of the Week

Does the "peace of God that surpasses all understanding" (Philippians 4:7) describe the life that pulses through my heart these days?
