I shall come back to this and edit at about 4 this afternoon, with a different mindset and the events of the afternoon inspiring and perhaps altering my perspective, so I will change and tweak words around - or perhaps not.

This could equally work as a metaphor for our writing worlds... pick up the pen and just write - now this minute... don't stop to let your inner editor guilt you into perfectionism... nurture an easy relationship with your paper and you will find that all the things you should be doing won't have the ability to overwhelm you. Anyway who gave them the label "should"? If you are a writer, all you should be doing is writing ....

This intro is just a series of words, very raw writing which will be read out next week. Hopefully thought about and considered... nothing wrong or right about it - the words just exist on a piece of paper and someday might become an essay, or a prologue if nurtured appropriately - or nothing -Sham just existing as a piece of writing in its own right, marking the time I spent at the computer today and becoming a part of social history.

It really doesn't matter.

I had to start somewhere.
