Reflections on the weekend Scriptures 1 Kings 19:4–8; Psalm 34; Ephesians 4:30–5:2; John 6:41–51

• Persistence. That is what the angel of the Lord needs when visiting Elijah in the desert. Notice that one visit was not enough. In the account from the first book of Kings, the angel brought food and water to Elijah and nudged him to get up and eat. Elijah obeys, but then lies down again. So the angel has to return, touch him again, and order him to get up, eat, and begin his journey. This does the trick, as after this second meal Elijah finally resumes his walk across the desert. Like a parent trying to get their child up for school, one attempt is not enough.

• How should we treat one another? Saint Paul's Letter to the Ephesians sums it up in two verses: Remove "all bitterness, fury, anger, shouting, . . . reviling, . . . (and) malice." Instead, "be kind, . . . compassionate, (and) forgiving" (Ephesians 4:31-32). Eliminate the negative and choose the positive. This is not always as easy as it sounds. It helps to see the goodness, or the potential for goodness, in everyone. "Be imitators of God," in other words (Ephesians 5:1).

• The bread that the angel brought Elijah sustained him on a forty-day journey through the desert to Mt. Horeb, a place where he could encounter God. The bread that Jesus gives us, the very bread of life that Jesus is, is meant to sustain us on our journey to God. We may not be prophets like Elijah, but we all have difficult periods on our journey through life. Jesus, the Bread of Life, can sustain us during these times.

Question of the Week

Can I identify times in which Jesus has sustained me in difficult situations? How can what I receive today sustain me throughout the week ahead?

but twice to get him going! In most basic terms, personal motivation happens for one or two causes. First to improve/change something on a personal level or, to improve the status/goal of another. It is always a temptation to "take care of number one" in our day to day living but, as Christians, we are called upon to an altruistic point of view, chosing through self sacrifice to benefit others in place or self, or in some cases, in addition to one self. So, then, WHY would someone make an effort to improve the lot of another? Why try to accomplish this? In reality, the reason is that in helping someone else, we believe that God sees our actions and will reward us with the gift of eternal life. So, does this future reward motivate you to accomplish acts of goodness to help others? This is where spiritual muturity comes into play for in some cases it does to be sure, while in other cases, selfishness and self centeredness rob us of opportunity to live out the Christian principals of daily living. How about us? Does it take an angel to visit us a few times to get us going, or do we rise to the occasion just because it is the right thing to do? These are great things to think about.
