Large Paper Grocery Bag 2 1/2 Tsp. Baking Soda Glue

Glue 2 Tbsp. Vinegar White Yarn or White Glitter

Stapler (optional) 1/2 Cup White Sugar Safety Scissors

Yarn (optional) 1/2 Cup Butter Scrap Pieces of Construction Paper

Buttons (optional) 1 Egg Googly Eyes

Crayons or Markers 2 1/2 Cups All Purpose Flour Clear Contact Paper (optional) Stuffing (one of the following:) 1 Cup Molasses Old File Folder (optional)

Newspaper 1 Tsp. Ground Cinnamon Brown Construction Paper 12" x 18"

Shredded Paper 1 Tsp. Ground Ginger Cotton Batting 1 Tsp. Ground Cloves

Cotton Balls 1/2 Tsp. Salt

3/4 Cup Apple Sauce 1 Gingerbread Cookie (or teddy graham)

1 4.12 oz. Bottle of Cinnamon Graham Crackers

Cookie Cutters Frosting

Drinking Straw Assorted Candy to decorate with

Ribbon or String Pint Size Carton (milk)

### Snack Ingredients:

6 Cups All Purpose Flour

1 Tbsp. Baking Powder

1 Tbsp. Ground Ginger

<u>Paper Bag</u> <u>Gingerbread Man</u>

### Materials:

Large Paper Grocery Bag

Glue or Stapler

Yarn (optional)

Buttons (optional)

Crayons or Markers

Newspaper/Shredded Paper from a Personal Shredder/Cotton Batting/Cotton Balls

#### Directions:

Fold the bag flat.

Trace a gingerbread man shape and cut out (make sure there are two pieces a front and a back.)

Let your child decorate one cut-out (you may wish to do both, if you are going to hang from the ceiling) any way they wish. You can use yarn for hair and buttons down the front if you wish. Color in the face and any other details with the makers or crayons!

Once the decorating is complete, glue or staple the two sides together leaving a small opening to stuff through. Once dry (if using glue) then stuff with crumpled newspaper, shredded paper, cotton batting or cotton balls.

Close the small opening with glue or staples.

Display your gingerbread man. (These are fun to hang from the ceiling!)

<u>Paper Plate</u> <u>Gingerbread Man</u>

### Materials:

Paper Plate (not foam)

Washable Brown Finger Paint

Buttons (optional)

Crayons or Markers

Brown Construction Paper

Tape

Glue

White Yarn (or white glitter)

### Directions:

Print and cut the following template out of brown construction paper: (All but the body piece)

Have your child paint the paper plate brown. Let it dry.

Tape the head, arms and legs onto the paper plate to form a gingerbread man!

Add in the features with color crayons or markers.

Use the glue and white yarn or glitter to add the "frosting" to your gingerbread man!



### Gingerbread Garland

### Materials:

Gingerbread Man Template

Brown Construction Paper 12" x 18"

Tape

Glue

Googly Eyes

Crayons, Markers, or other scraps to decorate with

#### Directions:

Print and cut out the gingerbread man template.

Fold the brown construction paper with an "accordion fold."


Place the template on the folded construction paper and trace around the pattern. Make sure that the "hands" of the gingerbread man touch the folds of the paper.

Cut out around the Gingerbread man shape. You should have a row of connected gingerbread men!

You can usually fit several rows onto one sheet of construction paper. Once they are all cut out, you can attach them with tape to create one long garland.

Glue the googly eyes on, and decorate any way you would like!





### Gingerbread Man Collage

### Materials:

Gingerbread Man Template

Safety Scissors

**Brown Construction Paper** 

Scrap pieces of construction paper (any Color)

Glue


### **Directions:**

Print and cut out the gingerbread man template. Trace onto the brown construction paper and cut out.

Let your child cut scraps of construction paper with the safety scissors.

Encourage your child to glue them onto the construction paper shape. (Any which way is fine, you don't need to try to get all the features in!)





### What is Ginger?

### Materials:

Ginger Template

Ginger Root

Pen or Pencil



### **Directions:**

Print out the ginger template

Observe the ginger root with your child.

What does it look like, feel like and smell like?

Cut a small piece of the root off. What does the inside look like feel like and smell like?

Write down your child's observations on the ginger template.

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### The History of Gingerbread

### Materials:

Flag Template

Markers or Crayons



#### **Directions:**

While the earliest forms of gingerbread can be traced to the Egyptians and the Romans, the Germans baked what is more traditionally thought of today as gingerbread. During the middle ages, bakers in Germany would make beautiful gingerbread creations (especially around Christmas time!)

Color the top stripe black, the middle stripe red, and the bottom stripe yellow.



### Old Fashioned Gingerbread

### Materials:

1 Tsp. Baking Soda 1 Tsp. Ground Cinnamon

2 Tbsp. Vinegar 1 Tsp. Ground Ginger

1/2 Cup White Sugar 1 Tsp. Ground Gloves

½ Cup Butter 1 ½ Tsp. Baking Soda

1 Egg ½ Tsp. Salt

2 ½ Cups All Purpose Flour 1 Cup Hot Water

1 Cup Molasses

#### **Directions:**

In a small cup pour 2 tablespoons of vinegar. Explain that when baking soda and an acid combine, they make bubbles. Stir in 1 teaspoon of baking soda, and watch the bubbles!

When the baking soda is combined in a batter, the same bubbles will form. The bubbles will help make the cake get bigger as it cooks.

### Gingerbread Houses

### Materials:

**Graham Crackers** 

Frosting

Assorted Candy to Decorate With

Pint Size Carton (milk)

### **Directions:**

Help your child to build a gingerbread house, using the pint size carton as a guide. Use the frosting as "glue" and build up four walls, and then attach a roof.

Once the basic structure is done, let your child decorate their house any way they want!



### Does Gingerbread Disolve?

### Materials:

1 Gingerbread Cookie (or Teddy Graham Cookie)

Cup of Water

### **Directions:**

What will happen if you put your gingerbread man (or Teddy Graham) into water?

Try it and find out.

Set a timer for one minute, three minutes and five minutes. What is the difference?



### Gingerbread Puzzles

### Materials:

Gingerbread Man Templates

Clear Contact Paper (optional)



### **Directions:**

Print and cut out the gingerbread man templates – also cut along the dotted lines to make two-piece puzzles.

Cover with clear contact paper if you would like this activity to last through more than one or two uses.

Help your child to match the gingerbread man halves together to complete each "puzzle"







### Gingerbread Me!

### Materials:

Butcher or packing Paper (large enough to trace your child)

Crayon or Marker

Measuring Tape

### **Directions:**

Trace your child's outline onto a piece of butcher or packing Paper.

Cut out the outline.

Help your child to measure with the measuring tape. How big of a gingerbread cookie would he/she be?

Let your child decorate their gingerbread self any way they choose!



### Gingerbread Game

### Materials:

Gingerbread Game Template

Die Template (or a die from another game)

Old File Folder (optional)

Clear Contact Paper (optional)

### **Directions:**

Print out the gingerbread game template. Cut out and glue to an old file folder if desired. Cover with clear contact paper if desired.

Cut out die template (or use a die from another game).


Take turns rolling the die with your child.


Count out the number of spaces on the die and move your character that many spaces on the board. The first one to reach the gingerbread house wins!

Cover with clear contact paper if you would like this activity to last through more than one or two uses.

Help your child to count out the correct number of Cheerios or Teddy Graham crackers and place on each card.
