Reflections on the weekend Scriptures

Ezekiel 18:25-28; Psalm 25; Philippians 2:1-11; Matthew 21:28-32

"Oh, when the saints go marching in, I want to be in that number!" And there's no season quite like autumn, with nature dying in stages before our very eyes, to remind us that sooner or later, we all have to march in that parade. How close to the front do we expect to be? Remember Jesus' challenge at the beginning of Ordinary Time way back last winter? "Be perfect, just as your heavenly Father is perfect" (Matthew 5:48). The danger comes when we begin to perceive ourselves as somehow eminently suited to a front-row seat, divinely destined to lead the parade. After all, we are among the few who always try to say yes to God in a world where so many say no.

But with Jesus, saying yes is not enough. Impressive words mean nothing apart from actual deeds. In Jesus' kingdom of "amazing grace," anyone, from tax collectors and prostitutes to less exciting sinners like us, can change. Though they may have said no, they can feel sorry, start over, begin anew, and finally *do* what the Father asked. In Jesus' kingdom, competition must give way to cooperation, factions to unanimity, and self-centeredness to self-sacrifice on behalf of others.

If only we "have in [us] the same attitude that is also in Christ Jesus," dramatically described by Paul as having "emptied himself" (Philippians 2:5, 7). In the end, God, who is not only fair but Fairness itself, as Ezekiel declares, does not impose judgment, but respecting our freedom, lets us judge ourselves, then lets our judgments stand.

If at times I've been the one who said no, what would my saying yes to God look like in my life this week?

This happens occasionally to some and chronically to others and leads me to provide a word of advice to all. Start small and work bigger. Conversion of heart (what we are really getting at) begins with conversion in small things and then grows to larger. Jesus saw it in the worse candidates and

promises that because of this, their gift of eternal life is coming more quickly than others who are half hearted. One thing about Jesus: He is all about the walk and was quick to discount the talk.
