Reflections on the weekend Scriptures Acts 2:14, 22–23; Psalm 16; 1 Peter 1:17–21; Luke 24:13–35

• Peter summarizes the early community's faith by acknowledging the evil of Jesus' crucifixion. He also deflects blame, sets aside judgment, and instead celebrates "the set plan and foreknowledge of God" that led to Christ's resurrection and the pouring forth of the Spirit (Acts 2:23).

• The First Letter of Saint Peter links Peter's preaching in Acts with the Emmaus Gospel's Eucharistic images by reminding us that we were ransomed "with the precious blood of Christ as of a spotless unblemished lamb" (1 Peter 1:19).

• Emmaus evokes our Eucharistic liturgy. Now as then, on "the first day of the week," Jesus "draws near," unrecognized, and "walks with us," as we ponder" all the things that had occurred" this past week: hopes, disappointments, even doubts (cf. Luke 24:15, 18, 14). How comforting that, despite their "in person" experience of Jesus, those two disciples still did not "get" him: "We were hoping that he would be the one to redeem Israel" (24:21). After this "gathering rite," Jesus "interpreted . . . what referred to him in all the Scriptures," our Liturgy of the Word (24:27). When invited (Jesus never coerces), Jesus comes to table, and Guest becomes Host (in every sense), the timeless gestures (taking, blessing, breaking, giving) opening their eyes and ours to recognition. We should not be surprised or disheartened (the disciples weren't) if, just as suddenly as from them, Jesus "[vanishes] from our sight" (24:31). But like them, our hearts should "[burn] within us," compelling us to "set out at once and [return]" to the world, despite its darkness, to proclaim what we have heard and seen, to live the loving, self-sacrificing consequences of our Eucharistic encounter with the risen Lord (24:32, 33).

Question of the Week

Where did I encounter Jesus, perhaps by surprise, this past week? Where will I look for Jesus in the week that lies ahead?
