### Bangla Funds For The Needy

The Samhati (solidarity), a non profit Bangladesh Women's Organization, held its first benefit dinner and cultural show on April 5, 1986 at the Bannockburn Club House in Bethesda, MD.

According to Mrs. Noor Jahan Bose, the president of the group, the Samhati was formed about fifteen months ago to help their unfortunate sisters in Bangladesh, who are rejected by society and forced to leave their home and have no one to turn to. Samhati also helps children, some of whom are with these unfortunate women and others who are homeless and parentless. What the group does here is to raise funds and build shelters back home in Bangladesh.

The group has already raised over \$4000. With that it has built a shelter and a medicare unit for these women and children.

### Our Work with Mahila Parishad


- Large portion of work efforts from 1985-2000 supported Mahila Parishad, the largest women's organization in Bangladesh
- Samhati was instrumental in creating the first shelter in Dhaka for survivors of violence against women, Rokeya Shadan
- Started in a rented facility in December 1985
- Samhati provided a total of \$160,000 to finance Rokeya Shadan over the years and to fund the construction of a new facility in 1997







## 2000: Launched Katakhali Village Program



desh Women's Organization

- Created first holistic ecoempowerment project in this remote coastal area
  - Initially with local NGO SAP-Bangladesh
- Included adult literacy, leadership building, provision of healthcare and family planning
- Focus on skills training on sustainability, sanitation, nutrition, farming and small business development
- Tremendous positive impact within this community



### 2005: Launch of Rangpur Program

- Expanded eco-empowerment projects to the villages of Bathgari and Charani of Rangpur District
  - Partnered with Environment and Social Development Organization
- Women and girls receiving small loans and income generation training
  - Adult literacy, sustainability agriculture seed and sapling production, cattle and poultry raising, handicrafts, computer skills and generation of biogas and solar energy
- Three-year project resulted in over 400 women graduating from literacy classes and 300 more from other training programs





## 2007: Katakhali Major Updates



- Built brick & mortar health clinic and staff residence for Katakhali Project
  - Building serves as defacto cyclone shelter
- Provided immediate direct relief after Cyclone SIDR
  - Rebuilt 50 homes and deeded to female head of household



### IMF Civic Program Grants



- From 2007-2011 Samhati received annual grants of \$10,000-\$15,000 from IMF's Civic Program
- Graduated out in 2011



### 2008: Launched Natore District Program



- Work done in several villages within the Natore district
- Project includes adult literacy classes, training on sustainable agriculture, computer skills, creation of a media center and mobile library
- Scholarships also begun for middle and high school children
- Project now is run by local leadership



## 2011: Launched Laksmichap Program

- Within the Rangpur District, project includes support in a range of areas:
  - Education and scholarships
  - Health and nutrition
  - Skills training
  - A revolving small business fund

## 2014 Update

#### **Training**

- Adult Literacy and leadership classes, at more advanced levels
- Training on income generating skills: sewing, fabric printing, candle-making, confection making, vegetable gardening, etc.
- Approximately 300 villagers have learned to read, obtained vocational skills, and been trained on health and hygiene
- Katakhali women are sharing their skills by starting a literacy class for 32 women in a nearby village, Ganga Char

#### **Health Center**

- Since 2007, a fully-staffed medical center serves 500 families with routine healthcare
- Building serves as shelter during natural disasters

#### **Scholarships**

 182 children have received scholarships and 65 children have finished high school







## Climate Adaptation Activities

- Our Katakhali women are true climate warriors
- Samhati has introduced new homes that are sturdier and adapted to more severe storms and cyclones
- Our project leader has recently attended a 10-day UN training on eco-agriculture and how to farm in response to climate change
- The Katakhali women continue to participate in Storytelling with Saris, an art and advocacy project to bring attention to the issue of gender and climate change

## 2014 Update





Now in its 7<sup>th</sup> year, our work has brought strong positive change to the communities in Natore District in Northern Bangladesh

#### **Training**

- Adult Literacy classes have taught reading skills to over 500 adults
- In 2014, we provided scholarships to 20 children (14 girls, 6 boys)
- Computer Learning Center has 7 computers and provides a popular
   3-month training course
  - Last year, 120 students received training
- Purchased new sewing machines (now have 8) and embroidery machine for tailoring classes

#### Loans

- Provided interest-free loans to ten women to start their own businesses
  - Six started tailoring work and purchased own machines
  - Four are raising cows for a dairy business

### Additional Natore Initiatives

- Coordinating several initiatives in Hatiandah village
- Added a midday meal program in Narayanpur Primary School





### 2014 Update

This diverse community (includes several religious minorities) has developed an innovative "Rice Bank" program for sharing/stockpiling rice so that no one goes hungry

#### **Education & Health**

- Fund primary and pre-primary school supplies
- Provide 80 high school scholarships at 2 different schools
- Free health checks for schoolchildren and women
- Biannual eye check-up camp: has helped 650 people









### **Additional Initiatives**

#### **Literacy**

 Adult literacy program has helped 400 women to read and write

#### **Revolving Fund**

- Provided \$4000 toward fund for training women in income generation skills
  - About 100 women have been trained in sewing, organic vegetable cultivation, poultry rearing
