Tape




Instructions:

Materials:



Give your child the glue and let them make any design they want on their star.


Sprinkle with Glitter and let dry.



Pingeone Bird Feeder

Materials:

Pinecone

Peanut Butter

String

Bird Seed



Instructions:

Tie the string around the pinecone to form a loop (so that you can hang your bird feeder outside!)

Help your child to carefully put peanut butter all over the pinecone.

Roll in bird seed.

Hang outside in a tree or near a window so that your child can watch the birds enjoy their treat!
