FOR REFLECTION



WHAT'S HAPPENING WITH CHRISTIAN EDUCATION TODAY?

What's happening with CommunUNITY Sundays?

On Communion Sundays, children aged K-5 grade participate as a group in a project that benefits our community. The next three months projects are detailed below, and as always we appreciate your support!

On December 3, this Sunday the children will have a short lesson on the Season of Advent and then transition into thinking of others who are in need, rather than wanting gifts. The Children's Offering is traditionally distributed according to vote by the children. This year there will be a wealth of options for the kids to consider from Hurricane Relief, Wildfire Relief, Uganda ministry supported by Lois Stovall (a member at CCC), Gandhi Brigade, Shepherd's Table, and many many others. Please remember to bring gently used or new mittens, scarfs, coats, and boots for our annual mitten tree.

On January 7, the children will be wrapping diapers for Greater DC Diaper Bank. We will be collecting diapers for the project in the bin in the vestibule, size 3 and 4 are the most needed sizes, but any diapers, even in open packages can be accepted. In addition, DCDB takes donations of unexpired formula, personal care products (soap, shampoo, etc), feminine hygiene products, and baby gear (single & double strollers, baby carriers, and pack n plays).

Between now and February 4, we are collecting gently used kids backpacks, gently used-athletic shoes, regular pencils, colored pencils, protractor sets, solar scientific calculators, and small handheld pencil sharpeners for Krma-USPartners, a 44-acre women's cooperative farm in Uganda. Supplies can be purchased off the <u>Krma-uspartners Amazon list</u> or from any store, and deposited in a bin outside of the church office. As part of the February 3, commUNITY project held during service on Communion Sundays, kids will learn more about Krma and prepared the supplies for the team over in 2018.


