Summary

- Route omitted from Amtrak Basic System of May 1, 1971
- State-supported "Lake Shore": May 10, 1971 to Jan. 5, 1972
- LSL began regular service on Oct. 31, 1975
- Only one of three "experimental" trains to survive
- After first year it was Amtrak's 3rd-most popular LD train
- Today it's Amirak's 4th highest-ridership train (LD or SD)

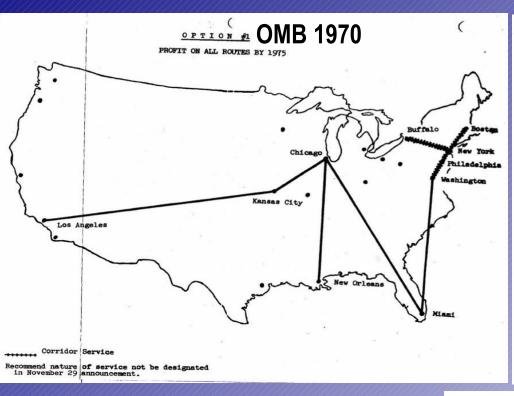

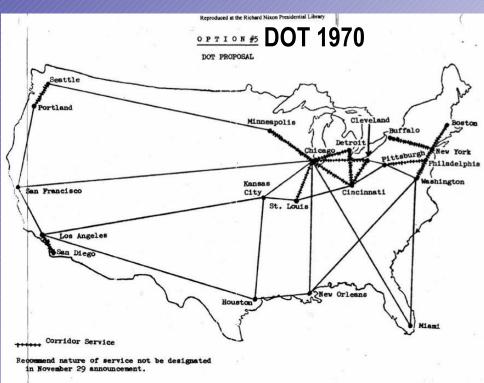

Amtrak's first state-supported train: "Lake Shore" Ohio & New York partnership: May 10, 1971-Jan. 5,1972



Amtrak 'Lake Shore' Summer 1971 W. 25th, Cleveland, OH

Foundations of the Lake Shore Ltd:

- New England sought a direct train to Chicago.
- US Senator Edward Brooke (R-Mass.) got \$15 million per year starting in FY73 for new, experimental train services.
- USDOT would award 3 experimental trains in 1974.
- Each train would be funded for two years before deciding whether to keep the train.

William Lind c/o US Senator Robert Taft Jr (R-OH):

- Hired as Taft's transportation aide in Fall 1973 after Lind mailed proposed schedules for new passenger trains.
- Taft's goal was to restore Amtrak service to Cleveland.
- Lind reached out to New England grassroots effort and expanded it to the entire route west to Chicago.
- Lind met OARP Prez Dave Marshall & Secy Tom Pulsifer in Dayton in April 1974 to activate Ohio rail advocates.



Bill Lind/US Sen. Bob Taft Jr - Part II:

- All congressional reps Chicago-East Coast urged Transportation Secy Claude Brinegar to name Boston-Chicago.
- Three experimental routes were named:
 - > Norfolk-Cincinnati (Mountaineer/Hilltopper)
 - > Washington DC-Denver (Shenandoah)
 - > Boston-Chicago (Lake Shore Limited)



Took more than a year before service could start:

- Two options west of Buffalo: PC via Cleveland, Toledo, South Bend or N&W via Cleveland, Fostoria, Ft Wayne.
- PC route: more populous but bad track.
- PC's bankruptcy trustee OK'd track upgrading BUF-CHI.
- Cleveland Union Terminal rejected due to cost of upgrading it and terminal use fees for just one train.



OARP: actively raised grassroots support for stations

- Stations considered in Ashtabula, Painesville, Cleveland (Lakefront or W. 150th RTA), Elyria, Sandusky and Toledo.
- Amtrak funds 3 Ohio station stops for initial service....
- Cleveland Lakefront: \$1,023,270 (new station facility)
- Elyria: \$67,000 (shelter, parking, platform, lighting)
- Toledo: \$64,000 (improved platform, lighting, waterline)

Ridership surprised many

- New USDOT Secy Coleman: LSL will be "Colossal failure."
- Biggest problem with stations? Not enough parking!
- Elyria in 1st year: more pax than Lima, Canton & Columbus!
- LSL: strong intermediate ridership, Chicago connections.
- Averaged 300 riders/train in first year.
- Reistrup: need 2nd round trip. Prez Ford budget cuts halted further consideration.

Stability through the years

- Ridership grew until 1986 to its 20th-century peak of 390,000.
- Diminished slightly after 1990 when it shared route west of Cleveland with rerouted Capitol Limited.
- Growing freight traffic congestion starting in the 1990s caused on-time reliability problems (Late Shore Limited).
- Schedule changed to ensure better Chicago connections resulted in inconvenient Ohio times.



21st century growth!

- Rising fuel prices caused Amtrak ridership to grow.
- Lake Shore Ltd ridership grew 33% 2000-2012.
- Broke all-time ridership record with 405,000 riders in 2012.
- Lake Shore Ltd is 4th-most heavily used SD/LD train in USA!
- Ridership dipped slightly after 2012 due to extreme freight train traffic congestion.

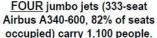


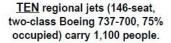


Amtrak's Lake Shore Limited service (Chicago-Toledo-Cleveland-Buffalo-Syracuse-New York City/Boston) has one eastbound train and one westbound train daily. These two trains average 1,100 riders total each day.

TWO east/westbound Lake Shore service trains carry 1,100 people each and every day.







18 intercity buses (81-seat, double-deck Megabus, 75% occupied) carry 1,100 people.









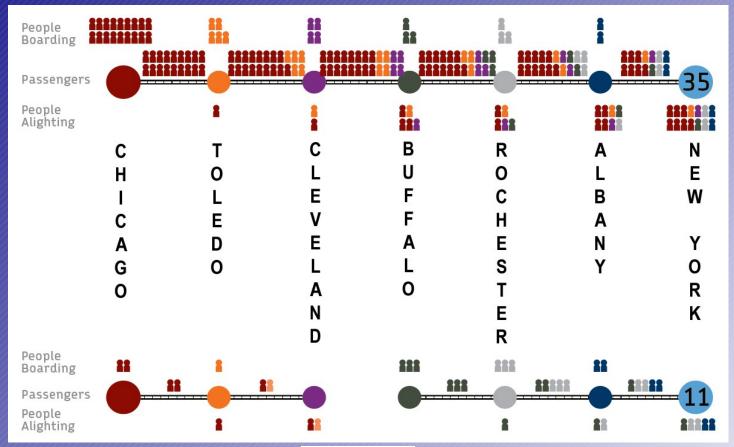








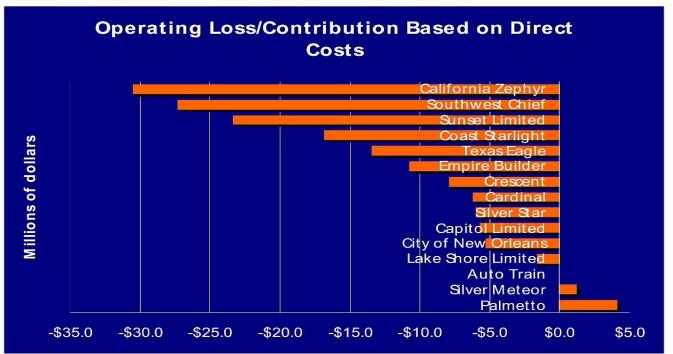
Lake Shore Limited 40th Anniversary
