Reflections on the weekend Scriptures

Acts 10:25-26, 34-35, 44-48; Psalm 98; 1 John 4:7-10; John 15:9-17

It is typical to think of love as a feeling, the way we feel about a spouse, a parent, a child, a close friend. Yes, this is love, but this is not the sense that Jesus is using when he says, "Love one another as I love you" (John 15:12). Love in this sense is a permanent condition, a part of one's character. As a part of our character, it can't help but flow out of us when we interact with others. Remember, Jesus began the Last Supper by washing the feet of the disciples, then telling them to do the same. *This* is the way we are to love one another.

Jesus tells his disciples that "No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends" (John 15:13). Fortunately, most of us will never be faced with actually putting our life on the line to save someone else. However, we can all accept the challenge of sacrificing some part of ourselves to give over our time and energy to someone else.

Cornelius was a recently converted Roman centurion, and normally an observant Jew like Peter would not enter the house of a Gentile. But Peter's focus was on others, not himself. Still, Peter was astounded to see the Holy Spirit descend upon these Gentiles just as it had on the disciples. So too may the Holy Spirit astonish us when we reach out to others outside our comfort zone.

Question of the Week

Can I improve my character so that I focus more on others' needs and less on my own needs? To whom can I reach out this week with my attention, time, and energy?
