I hope you will enjoy this alternative way to frame some of your stitching pieces.

I prefer to use the Freezer paper method for my wool work.




- Cut out the wool pennies, tongues, hanger tabs, and the background.
- Attach pennies to the tongues and hanger tabs. You can finish around these edges if you prefer with a buttonhole stitch.
- Sew these to the main piece of wool (The 7 x 7 piece)

Make sure the hanger tabs have enough space to put a branch through or whatever you would like to hang it with.


• Next is the finishing of the stitched piece. I have given the directions on the circle template page. With your stitched piece finished as a circle attach it to the center of the main wool 7 x 7 piece. I attached it with a buttonhole stitch. After this is done I finished the whole piece with another piece of 7 x 7 wool or you could use a cotton fabric with a fusible web.

Hope you enjoyed this little finish alternative.













Cut one circle form Cardstock This is to support the design to maintain its shape.

The next is a circle to be traced around your design, only if you stitched it on the same stitch count I used (25ct over 2). I do prefer to use a hoop so I can see the design and make sure I am not tracing over any stitching. See photo above.

This traced line is for you to use a gathering stitch on and NOT TO CUT OUT ON THIS LINE. You should cut your design out a 1/4 inch beyond this traced line. After you make a gather stitch pull slightly and add the cardstock circle to the back of the design. Center your work and keep going around the back gathered fabric with your thread and needle to keep it secure and less puckered. When your work looks even and you are happy continue with securing it to the center of your 7 x 7 piece of wool with a buttonhole stitch. By The Bay Needleart


