Jean Schafer, SDS is a member of the Congregation of the Sisters of the Divine Savior (SDS). For eleven years she has compiled and disseminated a monthly e-newsletter, 'Stop Trafficking', and at present serves as co-director of SDS Hope House, a transitional shelter for women survivors of human trafficking. Sister Jean is a member of the Southern California Partners for Global Justice (SCPGJ).

Udaya Kanthi Salgadu, author of the play, LETTERS FROM MY MOTHER, was rescued in 2000 by U.S Immigration after more than 4 years in slavery. CAST, the Coalition to Abolish Slavery and Trafficking, empowered Kanthi through healing to become an advocate for other victims as part of the Women's Caucus. She has earned her GED and certification as a nurse assistant. Her goal is to go to nursing school.

The play focuses on scenes from Kanthi Salgadu's life and rescue from enforced labor. We will listen to letters from her mother that kept her hope alive during her worst times and moved her to continue to struggle, not only for her own freedom but for the rights of other trafficked women. As a member of CAST, she has traveled to to Washington, DC to address the Congress of the country that she has come to love.

Sr. Ellen O'Leary, CSJ - Ellen expresses herself and teaches art, dance and mime. "In these arts if there is freedom, we go to that space beyond words, that is soul work."

Sr. Judith Royer, CSJ, PhD (Director) - is currently Interim Director for LMU's CSJ Center for Reconciliation and Justice and Professor of Theatre at LMU where she is producer/director for the Playwrights Center Stage new plays series. Among other awards, Sister Judith was the recipient of the 2012 Milan Stitt Award for her work as a playwriting mentor and teacher.

Doris Baizley - A Los Angeles playwright who teaches at East West Players' David Henry Hwang Writers' Institute and at LMU where she co-leads the Voices of Justice documentary playwriting program with Sister Judith Royer.
