## **Reflections on the weekend Scriptures** Joshua 24:1–2a, 15–17, 18b; Psalm 34; Ephesians 5:21–32; John 6:60–69

• Loyalty and gratitude—these are the two virtues that come to the fore when the faithful Israelites pledge to continue to serve the Lord. When Joshua asks them to commit to the god they well serve, the people immediately respond that they will not forsake the LORD. The Lord had led them out of slavery, performed miracles, and protected them on their journey to the Promised Land. They are grateful for all the Lord has done for them and they remain loyal to the Lord while living in the land of other gods.

• The second reading can be problematical, but it is important not to miss the analogy that Saint Paul is trying to make. Christ is to the church, he says, as husbands are to their wives. In other words, Christ's love for his people is like the love of a married couple for each other. Both involve sacrifice. A husband is expected to sacrifice for his wife, willing to leave his own parents, for instance. Jesus provided a model of this sacrifice in becoming flesh to be born into this world, and then giving his life for the world.

• All through August we have heard passages from the Gospel of John in which Jesus tells his disciples that he is the Bread of Life. They (and we) have heard him say that "I am the living bread that came down from heaven" and "Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life" (John 6:51, 54). Not everyone is on board. "This saying is hard; who can accept it?" many said (John 6:60). "Many of his disciples returned to their former way of life and no longer accompanied him" (John 6:66). Jesus challenged his disciples and not all of them could accept it. Can we?

### **Question of the Week**

It is time to take a stand. Can I say, like Simon Peter, "I believe"? Can I say, like Joshua, "I will serve the Lord"? How can I show others where I stand?
