REVELATION LESSON 33 HANDOUT

Please note the Miracle of Raising Jairus' Daughter is not a TRUE case of Resurrection according to Christ Himself in Matthew 9:24, Mark 5:39 and Luke 8:52 (see below). She must have been in a type of coma. While "sleep" is used by Christ in John 11:11 to refer to Lazarus' death, He explained such (John 11:14) but the case is different here, Jesus Himself plainly states she is NOT dead but is asleep. While many commentators claim that Jesus used the word"sleep" as a euphemism for her death, this would indicate a blatant contradiction of words. Thus, I do not place this miracle as one of the Resurrections but rather this Raising of Jairus' daughter is a miracle for she was raised out of a comalike "sleep." If Jesus had NOT raised her, she would have been buried alive and died being sealed in the tomb.

Matthew 9:24 He said unto them, Give place: for the maid is not dead, but **sleepeth.** And they laughed him to scorn.

Mark 5:39 And when he was come in, he saith unto them, Why make ye this ado, and weep? the damsel is not dead, but **sleepeth**.

Luke 8:52 And all wept, and bewailed her: but he said, Weep not; she is not dead, but sleepeth.
