Reflections on the weekend Scriptures Deuteronomy 4:32–34, 39–40; Psalm 33; Romans 8:14–17; Matthew 28:16–20

Jesus must have built anticipation among his disciples when he said, "All power in heaven and on earth has been given to me" (Matthew 28:18). With all the power in the world that he had at his command, when he could have done anything and ordered everything, Jesus then said: "Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you" (28:19–20). This, then, is what is most powerful: pass on the faith, teach others the way, and invite them to follow (make disciples). This is what can transform the world.

Matthew's Gospel ends with a reassurance from Jesus to his disciples: "I am with you always, until the end of the age" (28:20). Throughout history from creation to the birth of Jesus, God accompanied humanity. But during Jesus' ministry, God accompanied those who responded to the call in a more immediate way. Now, with the coming of the Holy Spirit, God accompanies us in the most intimate way.

The mystery of the Holy Trinity—three, but One—reveals the **importance of relationship**. The intimate relationship between Father, Son, and Spirit is an essential part of God's identity. From the beginning of time, God has been in relationship. **God has never been alone**.

Question of the Week

What can I do, with the guidance of the Holy Spirit, to transform my family, my community, the world?

remembered lost their lives in service to the nation and also because of the reminder that sacrifice is the cost of achieving freedom we all enjoy in this great nation. While part of the events of my childhood revolved around a parade, the real importance lies in visiting cemetaries and usually saying a short prayer for the deceased and sometimes bringing flowers for the grave site. I wonder often these days, how many people still visit gravesites? How many even remember the deceased who meant so much to them in life and now, often, it is like they never existed at all. Our Jewish friends have a custom which I would ask that you consider adopting as your own....the placing of a stone on the grave marker to attest that someone had visited. I highly recommend visiting the deceased in cemetaries often, praying for them, and leaving a stone as a marker that you were there. Secondly, please consider having Masses offered for the deceased on special days or at any time. This parish is always in need of Mass intentions and Masses spiritually aid our deceased on their way to eternal life. Memorial day, a time of remembrance, a time to lift up in prayer.
