

Ken Loach is embroiled in a war of words with a Cabinet minister over his new film's searing critique of welfare cuts .

Work and Pensions Secretary Damian Green criticised as "monstrously unfair" the portrayal of job centre staff in I, Daniel Blake, despite admitting he has not watched the film.

But Mr Loach has hit back at the comments, accusing the Government of being either "incompetent" or not fit to hold office.

In a comment to the Press Association, he said: "If they don't know what they are doing to people they are incompetent and shouldn't be in Government.

"If they do know what they are doing then they are not fit to be in Government."

Work and Pensions Secretary Damian Green has taken issue with the film's portrayal of job centre staff

The film tells the story of a 59-year-old joiner who is plunged into extreme poverty and confronted by a faceless bureaucracy when his benefits are stopped.

It has won rave reviews and was given the coveted Palme d'Or at the Cannes film festival, but has been criticised by Tory ministers past and present for its portrayal of welfare cuts.

Rebecca O'Brien, a producer on the film, told the Press Association that employees working at job centres and at the Department for Work and Pensions were consulted but were too scared to be individually named in the credits.

She said: "If he hasn't seen the film he wouldn't know that at the end of the film we thank the job centre workers who worked on the film. We spoke to many of them in the course of our research.

"We didn't actually identify them individually because they were so scared and asked to remain anonymous."

She said staff told producers that they were given secret targets to cut welfare payments.

Real job centre employees were consulted and worked on the film

"So many people have got in touch with us after the film saying 'I am Daniel Blake, it is my story'," she said.

"I thought it wasn't as huge a problem as I now know it to be. I realise now just how difficult it is to get benefits and how easy it is to get sanctioned.

"Lots and lots of people have contacted us saying this reflects their experience.

"We have witnessed far worse stories than those portrayed in the film, but we didn't portray them because we didn't think people would believe them."





Tory welfare secretary Damian Green branded hit Ken Loach film I, Daniel Blake a "monstrously unfair" work of fiction today - despite admitting he'd never seen it.

The film won the Palme d'Or at this year's Cannes Film Festival for its stark portrayal of a 59-year-old joiner facing nightmarish fit-to-work tests.

But Mr Green told MPs: "It is a work of fiction. It is not a documentary. It bears no relation to the modern benefits system."

He said he hadn't seen the film but, had seen a lot of trailers for it.

"And as I understand it," he said, "it is monstrously unfair to Job Centre staff, who are hugely conscientious people doing a job, sometimes in difficult conditions and doing it very well indeed."

Mr Green was speaking after he unveiled plans to reform fit-for-work assessments for disabled people.

He faced attacks from MPs in a testy debate in the House of Commons.

Hated former Work and Pensions Secretary Iain Duncan Smith welcomed the shake-up but said planned cuts to work allowances under Universal Credit must be scrapped.

"These need now to be increased to their original levels," he said.

Shadow Work and Pensions Secretary Debbie Abrahams warned people had "real anxiety" about possible "coded messages" in the green paper.

She said claims that Tory reforms make work pay are "derisory" and Universal Credit was a long-delayed "unmitigated disaster".

She renewed her call for the system of fit-for-work tests to be scrapped.

"It's a dehumanising system which is doing great harm and is nothing more than a vehicle for getting people 'off-flow'," she said.

Mr Green hit back by reading out a long list of comments backing his drive for reform by disability groups.


He added: "I'm afraid her carping at this is just out of touch with the sector of those who most represent disabled people."

Mr Green said he wanted to raise awareness of the health benefits of having a good job and make clear that "the idea that sitting at home living on benefits is in any way good for people - particularly people with a mental health condition - is completely wrong".

The Government will consult on reform of the WCA tests to deliver more "targeted and personalised" support and end the division of Universal Credit and Employment and Support Allowance claimants into groups deemed to be able or unable to work.

Employers will be encouraged to work with staff with long-term conditions to stop them falling out of work while Jobcentre Plus work coaches will help direct claimants to therapy.

Unveiling the Work and Health Green Paper in the House of Commons, Mr Green reiterated his commitment that no welfare savings were being sought as part of the reforms.

He said the Government aims to close the gap between employment rates of disabled and non-disabled people, which currently stands at 32 percentage points, with 4.6 million people with disabilities and long-term conditions out of work.

"When things need improving, like the Work Capability Assessment and fit notes, we mustn't shy away from big decisions," said Mr Green.

"We must be bold in our ambition to help disabled people and those with health conditions. This Green Paper marks the start of our action to confront the attitudes, prejudices and misunderstandings that, after many years, have become ingrained within the welfare state, within the minds of employers and across wider society."





The family of David Clapson, the former British soldier who died after his benefits were sanctioned, has formally requested an inquest into his death.

Lawyers for Gill Thompson, David's sister, lodged official papers with the Hertfordshire Coroner on Friday "on the basis that he died an unnatural death due to the imposition and effects of the benefit sanction imposed on him shortly before and in force at the time of his death."

After David died in July 2013, the coroner turned down further investigation and an inquest, ruling that his death was due to natural causes. But, backed by the Daily Mirror, Mrs Thompson has fought for three years for a public investigation.

Leigh Day law firm says there is a "strong public interest" in a fresh investigation because "a benefit sanction arguably played a contributing or causative factor in the death".

David Clapson, a former Lance Corporal in the Royal Signals, died in July 2013 from fatal diabetic ketoacidosis caused by a severe lack of insulin. He had been unable to keep his insulin at the correct temperature because – following a benefit sanction following two missed appointments – he had no money to turn on his fridge. The post-mortem found that his stomach was completely empty.

"He died with six tea bags, an out-of-date tin of sardines and a can of tomato soup," Mrs Thompson said at the time of his death. "There was a pile of CVs next to his body."

Today, she said: "Although this cannot change things for David, I will continue the campaign to help prevent further deaths and suffering on the vulnerable and sick in our society by the use of unjust sanctions."

The legal submission to the coroner states: "The role played by the imposition of a benefit sanction in Mr. Clapson's death, the systems in place to manage the risks posed by benefit sanctions to those who receive them, and the decision-making of DWP staff when imposing benefit sanctions on vulnerable and at-risk individuals, are of wider public importance and are matters of significant public concern.

"These matters have been considered in a number of reviews and reports, which support Ms. Thompson's submissions on the strong public interest in this case."

David Clapson served in Belfast at the height of the troubles before leaving the army to work for BT. After working for the telecommunications firm for 16 years and a further eight years for other companies he then became a carer for his sick mother. When his mother died, he found it difficult to find work, but Mrs Thompson said he was a proud man who was "the furthest thing you could get from a shirker". He also suffered from diabetes.

When the Department for Work and Pensions sanctioned him for a month, stopping his £71.70 Job Seekers Allowance, he was left unable to afford to top up his electricity key and unable to afford food.

In 2014, Mrs Thompson started a petition with Change.org that gained over 200,000 signatures which helped to secure a Parliamentary Select Committee Inquiry in March 2015. However, the Government rejected the Select Committee recommendation that the number of peer reviews into deaths of persons subject to a sanction be made public.

The Government also rejected Ms Thompson's calls for an Independent Review into David's death and the deaths of others in similar circumstances and of an independent body to conduct more reviews into the deaths of those in receipt of 'working-age' benefits.

Merry Varney from the law firm Leigh Day who is representing Ms Thompson in her fight for an inquest into her brother's death, said:

"We hope that these submissions will show the Coroner that there is a reason to suspect that David died an unnatural death and that an investigation should be opened with a view to holding a full Inquest into the circumstances of David's death.

"Inquests and Coronial Investigations play a fundamental role in ensuring preventable or avoidable deaths are identified and that steps are taken to prevent another tragedy.

"The United Nations recently expressed their concern at the absence of due process and access to justice in the UK for those affected by the use of sanctions by the DWP and an Inquest into David's death would be at least an initial step towards addressing these grave concerns."

Mrs Thompson added: "I would like to thank everyone for their overwhelming support throughout this campaign, and wonderful and heartfelt words of comfort, without this support we could not hope to make these changes."











Yesterday, in the face of repeated denials from the government, Oxford University academics reported the strongest link yet between foodbanks and sanctions.

Until now, people like Karen, 56, have not only been sanctioned and left to starve they have been repeatedly told by the government that having their money stopped isn't making them hungry.





"We continue to spend £90billion on working-age benefits to ensure a strong safety net, providing hardship payments, benefit advances and budgeting loans for those who need them most. Anyone who disagrees with a decision can appeal."

Iain Duncan Smith's DWP refused to admit obvious truths - for example, that







I know if I died in a DWP related death I'd want people to see me on this list too. It highlights the wrongdoing which comes right from the top with policy.

In a new revelation it has come to light that no company is brought in to quality assure DWP procedures. Esther McVey claimed that DWP procedures were quality assured but this is only something approved bodies can do such as Price Waterhouse Coopers.

Remember voting for who we had in Government from 2010-2015 will mean more deaths. You may be perfectly healthy today but some of you are just around the corner from sickness, disability or a life-changing illness. Even ex-Tory voters have come forward and admitted they voted Tory until illness struck them.

Before voting keep the people below in mind and ask yourself if you are a humane person because these deaths need not have happened.





A number of coroners have come out and stated the DWP played a role in the death of their clients. The DWP have the cheek to say the coroners are wrong – who are you more likely to believe – the professionals whose job it is to investigate deaths or a Government department with its own agenda?

Coroner Michael Oakley said the DWP benefits assessment was key to the death of Nick Barker. Coroner Andrew Haigh concluded the death of Tim Salter was mostly caused by the DWP who drastically reduced his benefit.

Meanwhile these people died under questionable circumstances with the DWP. Cecilia Burns had cancer. The DWP declared her fit for work. She appealed the decision but died shortly after winning her appeal. Chris Cann was housebound after losing both legs and a finger. The DWP insisted he exited his home to attend a fit for work assessment. This shook Chris up badly and he died of a suspected heart attack. **Leanne Chambers** had depression for years. The DWP sent her a letter to attend a fit to work assessment. She left the house that night and her lifeless body was later found in the River Wear. David Clapson died after because he couldn't power his fridge to keep his insulin cool after the DWP removed his benefits. DWP responded saying they were following procedure. David Groves stopped work after a string of strokes and a heart attack. DWP told Atos to call him in for a fit to work assessment. He died the night before. His widow said he was in a terrible state and the stress killed him. Stephen Hill suffered heart problems and was waiting for major heart surgery. DWP declared him fit to work following a ten minute Atos check. He died of a heart attack. Edward Jagcues fatally overdosed because he was not given a correct assessment by the DWP an inquest heard. Brian McArdle was paralysed down one side and couldn't speak. He died the day after being found fit for work by DWP. Mark Mullins & Helen Mullins died in an apparent suicide pact after not having the correct access to benefits. There are many more people like this.
