These vintage paper dolls were popular when home crafts and women's magazines were pre-TV companionship. They have been redesigned for modern tastes and technology. In some cases, the colors have been heightened to make the dolls and their clothing more appealing. In addition, many of the doll collections have been enlarged to facilitate a child cutting out the dolls, clothing and tiny accessories. This is in answer to my own childhood frustration of not being able to neatly cut out small paper doll hands and feet. These paper dolls can be printed out by your computer printer on regular paper and then glued to cereal box cardboard before cutting out to reinforce the dolls for childhood play. If these paper dolls are for an older child or collector, try buying a ream of 110 pound heavy card stock to print on your computer printer. Your dolls, dresses and accessories will be pleasantly firm and yet, still easy to cut out. You will have a nice study paper doll for play or display, brought to you from the past by Sunbonnet Smart.

Grace Drayton's cartoon characters brought joy to many children and their families in the 20th century and now, almost a hundred years later, her drawings are still popular today. Grace and her sisters grew up in Philadelphia. She was a prolific and accomplished artist, belonging to the most prestigious artist circles. She was actively drawing from 1904 until her death in 1936. She is most famous for designing the Campbell's Kids and Dolly Dingle, although she painted in oils and was a student of Robert Henri.

It's Christmas morning! In this companion page that follows Dolly Dingle's Christmas Party Part I, Billie Bumps, Dolly's friend, plays Santa to give out all of the gifts from under the tree. His blue stripe pajamas match Dolly's pink striped ones and as they are facing each other, they make a darling set for display on the mantel. Baby is dressed for the occasion and there are plenty of wonderful old time toys to enjoy. There are toys for all three children, but the best is a Lady Doll with all her clothes for Dolly Dingle.
