We still converge at the El Florido market in Otay Mesa to complete the loading for the seven different routes in Mexico. The management of El Florido has been more than gracious, allowing us to take over almost half their parking lot with up to 14

trucks to distribute the cargo. Several store employees pitch in by loading the products we purchase there as well as moving around goods from other stores. Keeping track of all the products for all the trips can be challenging. Even with all the planning and diligence, it's not



unusual to hear someone say, "I don't have enough eggs," or "Are there any more beans?" We are so thankful for all the help we get each month at El Florido.


During his time with MCCA, he made over 200 trips to Baja CA until 2013. From those years he has fond memories of the various

activities he was involved in. These activities included making trips to the Bakersfield area with Art Cooper for carrots and potatoes, picking oranges from his grove in Redlands with MCCA members, and serving on the board for several years. One story he remembers occurred on a trip and involved a little girl at one of the orphanages. She asked him his name, and in spirit of simplicity he said, "Juan", to which she replied, "Juan..., two, three, four...".

He has enjoyed serving with all the various people who have volunteered over the years with MCCA and the blessing of being involved with people who believe they are being the hands of Jesus, who are just performing a willing service for people who need help for the glory of God.

The August trip was dedicated to **Ralph Porter** of 29 Palms. For many

pickup these Marines as early as 2:00 a.m. to meet us in Escondido. This continued until 9-11 and then the Marines were no longer allowed to leave the country.

Ralph's life revolved around the Marine Corps and reaching these young men and women for Christ.

On his first trip to Mexico, he saw the Lopez family living in a dirt hut. From that time forward, he took supplies and shared the Gospel from that initial encounter. He continued this until he stopped going to Mexico in 2009.

#### **New ministry**



MCCA recently began supporting a new ministry, **Joshua's House.** Joshua's House is a home for boys and youth in San Vicente, BC, about an hour and a half south of Ensenada. It is currently home for 10 to 12 boys ages 13 through 18. The

director is Mike Meyerpeter, who lives at the home.

Mike's ministry was recommended to MCCA by friends of MCCA as well as one of our current recipients, Jeanie Sue Phegley of Casa del Pastor. Jeanie Sue told us "Mike has been faithful to his calling for about 15 years. He is a kind and considerate servant of the Lord. At first, he was coming with us, but he then found a greater need with young teen guys and branched off to begin his ministry in our



same San Vicente. He has been using most of his own funds for his ministry and keeps moving forward in the Lord. I would recommend him."

When Mike was asked why he chose the name of the ministry he said, "I was studying the book of Joshua at the time we were doing the paperwork for our 501 (C) (3). As Joshua was Moses' successor, we like to think that these boys are the future leaders here in their community".

Joshua's House is the main ministry of **Hebron International Ministries** in Menifee California.

The police found him in an abandoned room with nothing to eat or drink, crying and in a bad environment, including dope. He is now safe.

**Casa Del Pastor** is a home for mothers with their children. The ministry cares for the children and prepares the mothers to be self-sufficient. The exciting news is they now have their own school for the children.

**H.I.S. Ministries** in Tecate recently completed a fund raiser for school uniforms in their community, and they raised enough money to provide 600 uniforms for the local children.
