Trip Reports-Changes on the Horizon By Judy Arnett

Many of you know that any time MCCA trucks carry cargo from the U.S. into Mexico, those trucks must enter through a designated "declaration" line. Border officials inspect the cargo, and then they either let us pass because we are a nonprofit organization, or they assess a fee that can range between \$10 and \$50 (or more) per truck. For the past few years, prior to May 2016, there was no fee assessed. However, things were changing for us in 2016, and we were assessed what we considered exorbitant fees for the crossing of the border at Otay Mesa two months in a row--\$252 in May and \$400 in June.

Shortly before the July trip, four MCCA board members volunteered to go to Tijuana to seek help and guidance from Pastor Ana (Anita), our liaison with the Mexican government. She took us to the offices of El Chapparal, at the San Ysidro border crossing, where we met a woman who was sympathetic to our cause. She offered to work with Anita to help us meet the requirements of the Mexican border officials.

While still in Tijuana, the four MCCA board members went to the Costco store in Tijuana. We figured that the more we could purchase in Tijuana, the lower the fee might be at the border. We ordered sugar, oil, and laundry detergent from Costco for the July trip, which was just a few days away. We called our provider of oats and powdered soy milk in Mexico to see if he could have beans and rice for us by the following Saturday. He said he could. It was the first time, to my knowledge, that 14 trucks crossed the border empty and purchased all that we needed in Mexico! It was neither good nor bad—just a momentous occasion!

For the last three trips, we loaded four trucks with beans, rice, and Bibles and sent them across the border at El Chapparal with documentation required by the Mexican government. It worked! Each truck paid a nominal fee, and all were allowed to pass with only minor delays because of the advance work accomplished by Pastor Ana and her friend in the customs office at San Ysidro. It is our hope and prayer that we will be able to continue this practice.

October 8th trip report.

Four trucks carried beans and rice across the border. They were charged a minimal fee at the border and joined the rest of us at El Florido. We purchased the rest of our products at three locations in Tijuana: Costco, El



Mercado de Abastos, and El Florido.



We then met at El Florido to redistribute the products. These businesses have been very accommodating to us in preparing our orders and allowing us to pay with a credit card, thus eliminating the need to carry cash! The remainder of the

trip went great. It was a beautiful day to spend serving the Lord and seeing all the children.

Health care for the children

On a recent trip to Mexico, I attempted to find out about health care for the children. I spoke to a few orphanage directors, and some of the answers were differed, but there is health care for the children through "Seguro Popular." The coverage is free and is provided by the Mexican government. It covers most medical needs. These services are available at the general hospitals but not in more remote locations. In those areas, health care is obtained from local clinics that provide care at reduced rates or donated services and prescriptions. More severe conditions can be treated in the hospitals located in the larger cities.

Regarding dental care, I got different answers. One director said yes, it is covered; another said no. A third, director of Colina de Luz, had been praying for dentists, and a group of dentists from Tijuana agreed to provide care for all the children and staff at his orphanage. That is great news.

The bottom line is that there is care available, but the health care system is not always easy to navigate.
