

OPENING RECEPTION — Friday, March 1, 7–9pm Featuring *Unraveling*, a performance by Marcy Chevali

Be/Longing premieres in Washington, DC the work of the South Asian Women's Creative Collective (or "SAWCC", pronounced "Saucy"), comprised of women artists of the South Asian diaspora. Be/Longing is a story of rapture, struggle and fierce female identity, saturated with history, religion, and an explosive mix of ideas and materials. The artists tackle the politics of gender, hierarchy, and sexuality within the framework of a post-colonial globalized world. Referencing the body, directly or metaphorically, whole or dismembered, Be/Longing explores the duality of female experience. The creativity and pleasure of being female are contrasted with societal expectations of chasteness, passivity, and invisibility, and the reality of control, neglect, and violence. At the same time, the show addresses how diasporic women each with her own ambiguous identity and multiple allegiances navigate "belonging" to a country, a place, or a collective. Emboldened by collective action, these marginalized voices defy regional and sexual boundaries to connect with the greater question of what it is to "belong."
