Martin Figura was born in Liverpool in 1956. He left school at 15 to join the Army. 25 years later, as a Major, he left to become a photographer. His work has been widely published and exhibited, including at the National Portrait Gallery. His book This Man's Army was published in 1998 with a foreword by Billy Bragg.

He a member of The Joy of Six poetry ensemble which has played at festivals across England & Wales, and in New York. His own first collection The Little Book of Harm (Firewater Press) was published in 2000 with three subsequent reprints. Ahem (Eggbox Publishing) followed in 2005. He won the Café Writers Poetry Prize in 2006 and completed an MA (with distinction) in Writing The Visual at Norwich School of Art and Design in 2007. He has recently completed his third collection Whistle.
