Reflections on the weekend Scripture

Deuteronomy 6:2–6; Psalm 18; Hebrews 7:23–28; Mark 12:28b–34

• The faithful scribe only asks Jesus, “Which is the first of all the commandments?” (Mark 12:28). He gets more than he bargained for, as Jesus gives him two. Seen from God’s perspective, the pairing makes perfect sense. The human race was created in the image and likeness of God. Indeed, the human race was created from the love of God. So from the divine perspective, everyone is worthy of love. Everyone was made in God’s image. Everyone was made from God’s love. Viewing it from this perspective, we realize how the second commandment flows logically from the first.

• We also know that God is in every one of us. If we are to look keenly, the face of Jesus is visible in everyone’s face. The Holy Spirit dwells within us. Thus, loving your neighbor is loving God. And we know from the parable of the Good Samaritan what God is asking of us when we are told to love our neighbor.

• The scribe immediately understood why Jesus included the second commandment with the first. He recalls the words of Hosea, “For it is love that I desire, not sacrifice” (Hosea 6:6) when restating Jesus’ words. This is why Jesus tells him, “You are not far from the kingdom of God” (Mark 12:34). But now comes the important part: he needs to put this knowledge into practice. The scribe had the desire to do the will of God, understood the reasoning behind the answer, and expressed the expectation of putting it into action. Unfortunately, we never find out what this anonymous scribe goes on to do. One hopes that he lived the rest of his life according to what he has learned.

Question of the Week

Do I put these two commandments above all others in the way that I live my life? Do I see the face of Jesus in my neighbor?

Loving God and loving Neighbor. It is often said that Jesus life and ministry came to us to compliment and complete the Old Testament scriptures, and especially the 10 Commandments of Moses. There is no place that this is more clear than in this week’s Gospel reading where Jesus lays out clearly, and reminds us all that loving God is only the top half a a two faced coin with loving neighbor being both equally important and even fundamental to loving God. The reason for this is two fold. First, it is impossible to say that we love a God we have not seen while ignoring the brother or sister to our left or right. You just cannot do it and it renders this “love” hollow and empty and in effect, imply a grouping of meaningless words. Secondly, if we truly love God than our neighbor, born in his image and likeness cannot be of no consequence to us and we are compelled beyond this to become active in this love in caring for

him or her in their time of need, just as God does for us every day of our lives. The bottom line in all of this is to move us from inaction and being passive to a more active caring for others. Speaking of which, can you help with a Thanksgiving food basket for a needy family? God bless Fr. Roger


