Christmas in Mexico

Many orphanages have established their own traditions for this time of year. Colina de Luz begins Christmas morning with a Birthday song to Jesus. The Mission, an orphanage south of Ensenada, performs the Christmas story as a play for the community. At the **Door of Faith** orphanage, each dorm has its own Christmas tree. After opening presents on Christmas morning, a few of the leaders and several of the kids go to another orphanage to bring Christmas to the residents in the form of piñatas, small gifts, and lunch. The days before Christmas, many of the orphanages host Christmas parties for visitors. The groups bring presents and treats for the children, some of which are saved for January 6, a special day in Mexico. Known as 'Dia de Reyes' (Three Kings Day), this holiday, the 12th day of Christmas, represents the height of the Christmas season. The date commemorates the three wise men that traveled from afar, bearing gifts for the baby Jesus. The children of Mexico look forward to this holiday as, traditionally, gifts are exchanged on this date, not on Christmas Day, except for those living near the U.S. border where Christmas has become the gift giving day.
