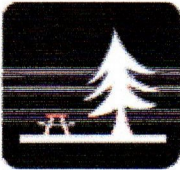

Raffle Dinner – September 28, 2013 – 6:00 pm

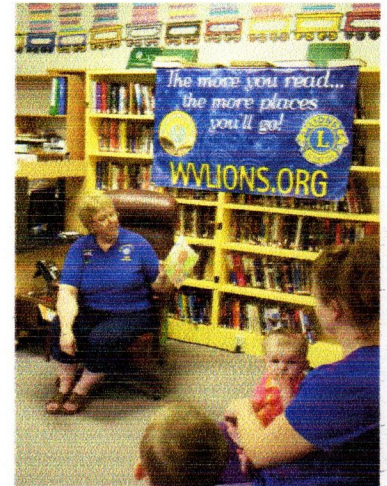

Wardensville Fall Festival – October 11, 12 & 13, 2013

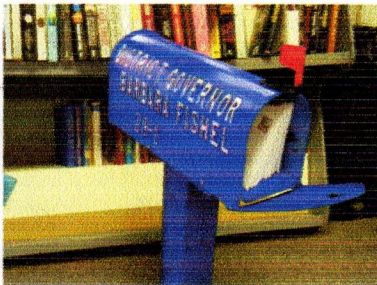

District Governor Fishel Participates in RAP

Wardensville Lions Club offers a Reading Action Program or “Story Time” for pre-school and elementary children at the Wardensville library every Thursday morning at 10:00 am. The Reading Action Program is an initiative of Lions Club International President, Wayne Madden and is designed to promote literacy. Each week there is a guest reader who reads a book to the children. This week West Virginia Lions - District Governor Barbara Fishel read two books to the group. Today’s Story Time theme was letter writing. The first book she read was The Lion and the Little Red Bird. Since District Governor Fishel is a retired Post Master, the second book she read was Please Write Back and it was about writing a letter to Grandma. At the end of the morning, each child is given a copy of a book to take home.



The children start the morning with a game activity before settling down to hear the story of the day. When the story is completed, the children participate in a craft activity. Today the children wrote a letter to family or friends. District Governor Fishel brought a variety of postage stamps for the children to put on their envelopes. When the envelopes were addressed and ready for mailing, the children placed their letters in the mailbox.



Games and stories and craft activities work up little appetites. The morning winds down with homemade snacks for the children. Today they had apple juice, fresh picked strawberries and a graham cracker decorated to look like a letter.

MD 29 HAS MERIT PEACE POSTER WINNER

Congratulations! The Jane Lew Lions Club's sponsored entry created by Courtney Lough has been chosen as a merit award winner in the 26th annual Lions International Peace Poster Contest.

About 400,000 children from 55 countries participated in this year's Peace Poster Contest. The posters were judged at club, district and multiple district levels before reaching the international level, at which point they had been narrowed down to 117 posters. Based on creativity, originality and portrayal of the theme, "Imagine Peace", Courtney's entry was chosen as one of 23 merit award winners. She will receive \$500 and a certificate of merit.

Courtney was a student at Robert L. Bland Middle School where she entered the contest. She is a 6th grader and has enjoyed art since she was very young. She loves to draw animals and flowers. Her entry was a pair of military boots with ID tags hanging from them and a pair of pink bunny slippers next to them. The military boots symbolize that Dad is home from serving in the Army. The bunny slippers symbolize all the little girls who are waiting for their dads to come home. She was inspired to draw this poster because her Dad had served in the Army National Guard.

Peace, to Courtney, "means that everyone should have the opportunity to live in a world without strife or at least be able to reach an agreement without weapons". The 23 merit award winners are from Brazil, Canada, Chile, China, Cyprus, Ecuador, Indonesia, Israel, Japan, Nigeria, Phillipines, Republic of South Africa, and the United States (Alaska, Hawaii, Minnesota, Missouri, Oregon and West Virginia). The grand prize winner is 13-year-old Jenny Park from California. Information about the grand prize winner is posted on the Peace Poster section of the LCI website.
