# About Farm Camp

Stone Barns Center's Farm Camp is in its sixth season. Camp sessions are designed for campers of different ages, ranging from rising kindergarteners through rising eighth graders. Our campers have the opportunity to see how the farm works and get their hands dirty by pitching in with farm chores and learning alongside our farm staff. In addition to activities focused on a specific theme, every camp session includes garden work, animal chores, cooking, crafts, games and hiking.



At Farm Camp, we also explore the farm-to-table connection. A staff food and nutrition specialist helps campers prepare healthy snacks. Campers take the recipes home so they can prepare these treats for their families.

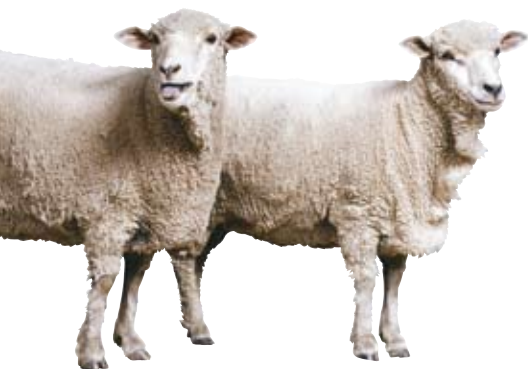

# Program Information



## Session Descriptions

At Stone Barns Center, our farmers are busy growing crops and raising animals. In July, campers will help with our garlic harvest; and come August, we will have more tomatoes than we can pick. Our busy hens will lay eggs all summer long, while our pigs root through the shady woodlands. This summer, Farm Camp offers both one-week and two-week sessions to accommodate busy summer schedules.

## One-Week Sessions

Campers entering kindergarten through sixth grade:

*A Week on the Farm*

Dig in for a week of farm fun. Organized in groups by grade, they will help in the garden, work with the animals, explore the pond and prepare farm-fresh snacks.

## Two-Week Sessions

**Sprouts** Campers entering kindergarten and first grade:

*Nature on the Farm*

Campers will learn about Stone Barns Center and perform chores alongside their counselors and the farmers. Activities may include egg collecting, planting seeds, exploring pond life and making snacks.

**Growers** Campers entering second and third grades:

*Cycles of Farm Life*

Campers will explore our gardens, visit our pond and care for our farm animals. Emphasis in this session will be on the cycles found in nature and specifically on our farm. We will spend our days playing games, doing farm chores, hiking and creating farm-fresh snacks.

**Farmers** Campers entering fourth and fifth grades:

*From Garden and Pasture to Kitchen*

Campers will start each day with morning farm chores and learn about the role farms play in their lives. They will tend the fields, care for the animals and learn how to prepare farm-fresh food. In addition to daily camp activities such as collecting eggs, harvesting veggies and moving the sheep, campers will begin to explore the farm-to-table connection. Whether picking tomatoes and learning to make salsa, or collecting eggs and learning to make omelets, campers will trace their food from field to plate.

**Foragers and Foragers Plus** Campers entering sixth, seventh and eighth grades:

*Food, Farming, and Community*

**Foragers** will have the opportunity to get more deeply involved in every aspect of the farm and surrounding woodlands. In addition to more in-depth chores, they will learn about wild edibles, discuss food policy, and prepare healthy, seasonal meals.

**Forager Plus** is a program for returning campers who have completed at least one session at the Forager level. Campers will participate in Forager activities as well as mentor younger campers and assist Stone Barns farmers with harvest and the farm market. Forager Plus is a bridge for campers who are on their way to becoming CITs.

## Dates to Remember

### Parents' Farm Tours

*Last Friday of each session*

Come to the farm for a private tour of farm life! Parents are invited on a tour of Stone Barns with one of the farm's senior staff. In addition to observing campers at work and play, parents will gain a deeper understanding of how Stone Barns works, and will be able to ask our farmers and staff questions.

### Parent/Student Chores

*Last Friday of each session from 2:30 PM – 3:30 PM*

Come to the farm and join in the fun! Parents are invited to work alongside their campers collecting eggs or exploring the vegetable gardens.

More information about tours and chores will be available at the Pre-Camp Open House. Sign-ups will take place during morning camper drop-off, Monday-Thursday.

## Refund Policy

Withdrawal prior to May 15, 2010: Total fee less 25% for administrative costs will be refunded if the space can be filled from our wait list. If the space cannot be filled, a refund will not be issued. Withdrawal after May 15, 2010: No refunds will be given for any reason.

- Farm Camp runs Monday through Friday, from 9:00 AM to 3:30 PM, regardless of the weather.
- All campers need to bring a lunch and snack to camp daily. Additional snacks will be prepared with the food and nutrition specialist throughout the week.
- Campers should dress for the weather and plan to be outdoors for most of the day. Please pack a change of clothes daily.
- All campers must wear closed-toed shoes to camp. Flip-flops and sandals are not acceptable for camp activity, and campers will not be permitted to go out with their groups if wearing them.
- Every camper needs a reusable water bottle, sunscreen and hat. Please remember to label everything with your child's name.
- Campers are encouraged to explore the farm with their counselors and are expected to listen carefully and respect our farmers' work.
- Stone Barns Center enjoys a partnership with Blue Hill at Stone Barns restaurant. Although the restaurant's busy working kitchen cannot accommodate campers on a daily basis, campers registered for all two-week Farmer and Forager sessions will have an opportunity to explore the restaurant's tea garden and cook in the kitchen once per session.

## Pick-up and Drop-off Information

- A note written and signed by a parent/guardian and given to the camp director is required to release your child to someone besides a parent/guardian.
- Campers are not admitted to the building before 9:00 AM. Pick-up is at 3:30 PM.

## Carpooling

## Registration Information

- Farm Camp registration is taken on a first-come, first-served basis. Applications will be accepted until each session is full, at which time a waiting list will be started.
- Registration forms may be submitted via fax or mail.
- Each registration form must be complete and accompanied by a non-refundable deposit of \$150 for returning campers or full payment for new campers.
- Full payment and all immunization forms are due by May 1, 2010. If full payment and immunizations are not submitted by this date, Farm Camp reserves the right to assign your space to another camper.
