As our February trip approached, there was some concern about what we might face. With rumors of gas shortages and demonstrations along the border regarding our new president, we did not know what to expect. One thing we have learned in the past is to expect the unexpected. As it turned out, the trip went fine. The fact that some roads were a little muddy from recent rain was the biggest issue.

What's in a Name?

In 2010, Juan Carlos Gonzalez and his wife Tania began making mission trips to "Your Brother's House," a ministry in Tijuana. Over the next couple of years, they made several trips to Tijuana. They met a pastor who was looking for a couple to take over his children's ministry. In





2012, they realized that this was the call God had placed in their hearts. In taking on this ministry, they now had to trust God. This was their first step of faith toward fulfilling the purpose God had for their lives. At that time there were

nine children living at the orphanage. There are now 15 children in their care. Their vision is to meet the spiritual, physical and emotional needs of the children, teach them the Word of God and develop the knowledge of Christ for their daily lives.

The ministry is named in the memory of their nephew Alexander Lubian, who lost his life in a tragic accident when he was only 19 years of age. He had a heart and passion for children in need, and he had a desire to visit the children at this ministry. Unfortunately, he never had



that chance. Juan Carlos and Tania renamed the ministry to keep his memory alive and see his legacy live on in the children.

(MNG) in Tijuana. Luis Salinas is the Director of MNG. which had its beginning 16 years ago when he started providing a safe place for at-risk boys. He found them in the dump, in the red light district, and in their homes, where life was not a happy place. (MNG) is a Christ-centered home that currently has 18 boys, ages 6-18, living there. It is Luis' goal



for the ministry to counsel not only the boys, but also the families, and "ultimately, reunite them with their families in a Christian home." Their primary U.S. sponsor is Kingdom Builders Ministry

There are more than 50 orphanages in Baja California. Early this month, we became the FIRST orphanage in Baja California to be fully certified under the new rules. An official ceremony for our orphanage was held in Mexicali, and the Governor of Baja California presented to certificate to Hector. This whole process was expensive for us, but so worth it!"
