Inspired by Jane Eborall's goat pattern.



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**(Red \* indicates the optional step for frontside/backside tatting.)**

Ra S/R 5/TW, SS (\*Rb throw off r of 4LP4TW) 7vsp4cl

Rc S/R 6/4vsp6

Rd S/R 6/4vsp5vsp1 SS

Ch 6 SLT, SS, p6 +(LJ 1st p on Rd)

Re (bring bead into ring loop at back of hand) S/R 7LP3/4b3

Rf S/R 5/3

\*Rg S/R 4-1-2/2 cl TW SS

\*Ch 4 (LJ 2nd p on Rd) SS

\*Rh S/R 8(+ p Rc)4/4 TW, SS

Ri S/R 5vsp1/6

Rj 1+(to p ri)6 SS

Ch 1,-1(X6) +(LJ between Rh and Ri) TW SS

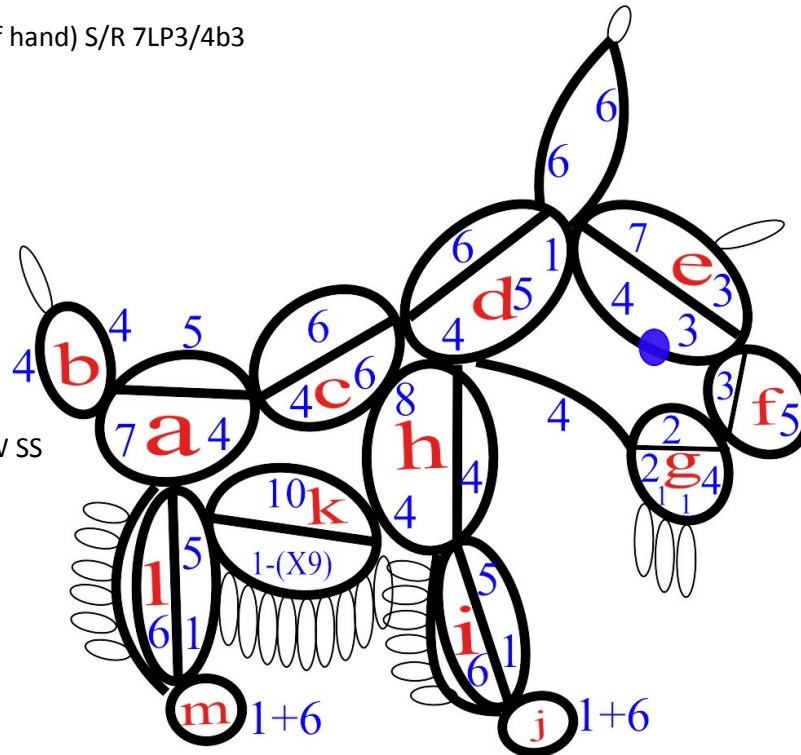
\*Rk S/R 10+(Ra)/1-(x9)TW SS

RI S/R 5vsp1/6

Rm 1+(to p ri)6 SS

Ch 1,-1(X6) +(LJ between Ra and RI)

Finish Ends



Two shuttles continuously wound with approx. 2 yds. each.  
The bead goes on shuttle number 2. Even though you will only use one bead, I find it helpful to put a bead on both shuttles, just in case.

ch =chain

+ = join

R =Ring

p,- =picot

S/R =Split ring

vsp =very small picot

TW =Turn work

LP = Long picot

LJ =lock join

SS =Switch Shuttles

Finish Ends = Cut, Tie and Hide Ends

As an additional step you can cut and fray the picots as I have done on this Scottie's beard.



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
