Re: Your complaints against the California Judiciary

Dear Mrs. Kramer:

This responds to your recent letter and phone call to the U.S. Department of Justice (the Department). In your correspondence and message, you request a review and investigation of your prior complaint to us.

As indicated in our prior correspondence to you, the Department has reviewed your original complaint and determined that the Department should take no further action, which determination did not constitute a decision on the merits of your case. We have reviewed our prior decision, along with the more recent information you sent us, and have determined that our decision was appropriate. We therefore will not take further action on this matter. The Department, in enforcing the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA), represents the law enforcement interest of the United States, rather than of individual complainants. In addition, because of the large number of complaints that we receive, compared to our limited enforcement resources, we are unable to open an investigation of every complaint that we receive.

As we informed you previously, this decision does not constitute a determination of whether a violation of the ADA occurred, and it does not affect your ability to pursue other legal remedies, including filing a private suit in federal court. Your local or state bar association may be able to give you names of private attorneys.

For the reasons stated above, the Department will take no further action in your complaint. We regret that we cannot assist you further.
