

## December

2014 HAS BEEN A EVENTFUL YEAR FOR ACE TRAINS.



The production of close on 1000 E/12 Duchess and Coronation locomotives was completed in some 15 different styles.

We finally managed to break through to being published as an Editorial piece in The Gauge 0 Guild Gazette in an excellent article by Martin Bloxom in the November 2014 edition.

We have dropped the coarse scale connotation and revived the original Gauge 0 Guild description of Standard Gauge for what we do.

Our latest production the E/27 Britannia has met with broad acclaim and has made the dividing line between kit built fine scale or indeed one off finished models indistinguishable from the ACE version.

The very popular Carette based Water Tower was re introduced. A tribute to the 1910 issue probably one of the best British style lineside structures ever made. For some reason the original gauge 0 version was sold without a back panel.

Our ACE/Wright six wheeled Van series was issued and later additions to the range included a Palethorpes Van and an SR Luggage Van.

Our tribute to Met 150 concluded with the delivery of the Westinghouse Bo Bo providing the biggest range of Met/LT types ever produced commercially. The Met Pullmans Galatea and Mayflower were unique contributions to the tinplate market.

The ACE line will continue in 2015 and gain momentum with a comprehensive coach programme and locomotives of most of the big four and their BR versions.








Production drawing








The 6W production is finished for the moment until the order books are full again and now CC pre-production is under way. As mentioned before our coach program will extend well into 2017. At the moment we have only the capacity of making 600 coaches per month which means 50 sets of 3 coaches in four liveries per month, it is the intention that we issue 4 new sets each month or so in 4 different liveries. 

At the event, many with whom I had the pleasure to meet of course asked me the same question. After my return to China I wrote a lengthy reply on the forum and it can be read HERE




Last Monday (24<sup>th</sup> Nov) we had a big meeting with the parts suppliers and I was able to send the following dispatch to our distributors:

#### Gentlemen,

The 6Ws are out of the way, CC coach production started so now as per yesterday we are in A4 mode. For each production there is of course a component list with various drawings of each component, an assembly manual, a QC manual, time schedules, stock lists etc. etc. all both in English and in Chinese. To prepare this takes most of the time and if done well the production goes without a hitch. (Touch wood). This preparatory work has all been completed, it contains 194 pages plus an additional 162 3D drawings.

The A4 consists of almost 400 parts that all have to be plated or painted or machined before becoming components fit for use. That is the stage that we are at now, ordering the parts and make components out of them. We hope that in about 6 months i.e. May/June the first A4s will appear.



We have an extensive list of names available in addition to three different finishes. Once production starts however, we have to draw a line under the offering and turn a new page in the order book that will have less options. Also we may be obliged to increase the RRP.



## What's New for December?

#### **Brand New Hopper Wagons**

During a trip earlier this year to ETS in Prague, myself and Colin Toten from Raylo were intrigued to see a prototype of a proposed hopper wagon which was very much of European outline. ETS wondered if it would have any potential in the UK but we felt it would really need to be far closer to a British outline design to work in this country. When we returned home I sent some photos to Jiri Nemecek, the chief design engineer at ETS, and during our recent visit in October, he presented us with a completely new prototype design.







Note photos are pre-production prototypes and are subject to improvement before production

We rather like these and so we are now planning to produce a range of Hopper Wagons, which will be exclusive to **WJVintage** and **Raylo**.

The first two proposed releases will be London Brick and wartime MOT (Ministry of Transport) Iron Ore as represented below by pictures of the Hornby OO scale 21 Ton Hopper Wagon.





We hope these should be available by the spring of 2015 and the anticipated price will be £45.00 each (plus P&P). Colin and I will have the prototypes with us at all the shows we attend over the coming months so do please come along to have a look. We would very much appreciate your feedback and you are of course welcome to pre-order should you wish to.

Final production quantities have yet to be finalised but they will be limited, and I would anticipate between just 50 and 100 of each. I will of course keep you updated via **Just the Ticket** over the coming months.

#### **Railcar Update**

The first batches of Railcars have arrived and all my stock at any rate has been sold! The good news is there are more to come and I should have a delivery **before Christmas** that will include a further small quantity of GWR Chocolate/Cream Passenger Railcars PLUS the first delivery of the GWR Chocolate/Cream Parcels Railcar.

**Update - WJV01024 - War Office (WW1) Tank Wagon First Delivery in time for Christmas!** 

Last month you may recall I launched a new WW1 War Office Tank Wagon with the intention of producing a limited run of 50 pieces.

Well I have had a slight change of heart - bear with me and I'll explain.




Firstly let me say, the uptake on these has been very good indeed so thanks to all of you that have pre-ordered. It has been so good in fact that I think I may have underestimated the demand for these.

#### Here is the plan

I will now produce 100 WW1 War Office Tank Wagons to commemorate 100 years since the beginning of the Great War. For every one I sell I will make a donation of £1 to be split equally between the Royal British Legion and Help for Heroes. So if I sell them all I will donate £100 total to charity.

#### And there's More!

Furthermore, I have had a word with ETS and they have agreed to split the run into four different running numbers. As I mentioned last month, wagons numbered 50 to 74 were all produced under the same procurement order to the same design. So I have selected Nos. 50, 57, 65 & 74 and we will have 25 pieces of each number. I think this should adequately maintain the collectability of these, and of course if customers order more than one, they can have different running numbers for each (up to 4 pieces and subject to availability).



The plan is to have half of them **available in time for Christmas** and the balance in January. They will be priced at **£42.50** each plus P&P (£4.50 for the UK).

If you would like to place an order, or amend your existing order, please get in touch with me as quickly as possible. All existing orders will remain on the system and I will allocate a running number randomly unless you specify a personal preference. I hope that is all clear.



Here is something a little unusual you might be interested in. The attached Press Release issued by <a href="www.readongeton.org.uk">www.readongeton.org.uk</a> the recently launched national literacy campaign spearheaded in Wales by Save the Children. I was invited to produce a special Jack the Station Cat story for the campaign and this is being used as a tool to help parents and children. I shall be sending another classic loco for your consideration.

The press release follows below:

#### A Cat with a Mission supports charity literacy campaign in Wales.

On 1 October, leading charities, organisations, teachers and children's authors launched a national mission in Wales to get all 11 year olds reading well by 2025. The coalition called Read On. Get On, Darllena.Datblyga in Welsh will galvanise the nation to play its part in making this happen. Alan Cliff children's author from Rhyl has lent his support by writing a ten minute story for the UK wide literacy campaign called 'Jack the Station Cat: Special Agent 'a new adventure for his much loved feline friend . Reading is the key to a child's future; it unlocks their potential and opens up a world of opportunities. However, every year, four in ten (40%) of pupils in Wales still arrive at secondary school with reading ages below their chronological age [Estyn 2010-11 report]. The recently published Welsh Government National and Numeracy test result also showed that children living in disadvantaged areas did less well with their reading than those in more affluent areas. A report by the UK 'Read On. Get On.' coalition called 'Reading For A Fairer Future,' also found that GDP (Gross Domestic Product) in 2025 could be £32 billion higher if action had been taken to ensure all children were reading well by the age of 11. The report also found:

- 73% of 8 to 11 year old girls said they enjoyed reading compared to 59% of boys.
- Children are not reading enough outside school, or with their fathers. Five year old children whose fathers read to them daily will be almost half a year ahead in their reading a few years later, than a child read to less than once a week. Alan Cliff says of the Campaign; "I am honoured to support STC's literacy campaign in Wales because I believe the ability to read opens a path to life-long learning. In the modern world the inability to read is a grave hindrance to fullness of life. Every child should be given the opportunity to learn to read and to be constantly encouraged in their efforts. Confident readers invariably become confident in all aspects of life."

'Read On. Get On' aims to create a nation of strong readers by:

- supporting parents to read with young children for ten minutes a day
- urging the public to volunteer to help disadvantaged children improve their reading
- building a powerful coalition of the most influential public, private and charitable organisations to pledge to support the mission
- urging all political parties to support the 2025 target and two interim 2020 goals

# World War 1 Remembered



t is now December 1914 and many associate the festive season on the Western front as a time of fraternisation, games of footie and handshakes all round. Wrong. There were \_acts of fraternisation amongst soldier's who had no clear guidance as to how to conduct themselves in such unusual circumstances, and yes, men did meet in No Man's Land, exchange smokes and stories and indeed kick a football or two about, but this was far from a universal experience and it was very short lived. Take for instance Lance Corporal 12628 Herbert Goodley of 3<sup>rd</sup> Grenadier Guards. While some were able to enjoy such acts of fraternization, this soldier was shot dead on Christmas Day 1914, as were many others. Back at 'Blighty,' families came to accept that the war would not be 'over by Christmas' as had been widely predicted and Christmas Trees and decorations would be put up with a bitter-sweet realisation that husbands, son's, brothers, friends and neighbours were now no longer part of the annual ritual. In an attempt to keep up spirits, comforts from home were sent out in their hundreds of thousands ranging from Fortnum & Mason food hampers for officers to knitted scarves and balaclavas for 'Tommy' who was now beginning to get very cold and damp. The Christmas Truce is much discussed but little documented as authorities were determined to 'gloss over it.' The Sainsbury Christmas advert, essentially for a bar of chocolate is set during this Christmas truce. It was worked on by a military historian I happen to know and if you haven't seen it already, can be viewed HERE
