Prime Minister David Cameron visited flood-hit Surrey for a second time this week to see how residents are coping with the crisis.

He visited flooded Chertsey on Saturday (February 15).

Mr Cameron met with military personnel to find out how the armed forces were helping with the flood relief efforts.

He also visited the Runnymede Centre, in Addlestone, and met with some of the volunteers including Surrey's 4x4 Response team.

They tweeted to thank the PM for his visit.

Mr Cameron visited Staines on Tuesday (February 11) with Spelthorne MP Kwasi Kwarteng.

But some locals were less than impressed with the politician's second appearance in Surrey and the fact he didn't meet with residents.

Jo Ward, of Frithwald Way, Chertsey, said: "We want to know what you [David Cameron] are going to do about it.

What's the plan?"

Fellow Frithwald Way resident, Flavia Gray, said: "I saw him on the TV so we headed to the Runnymede Centre. I would have asked him 'what are you going to do?'

"How did we not know this was going to happen? We pay our taxes and surely money should go towards finding this out. We want to know how we are going to be protected."
