Sons of Pitch(s— Powerful nose of orange and lime. Fruit driven and intense. The palate shows fresh citrus fruit with some figgy richness and a hint of toast. Good acidity: a brilliant effort. Slight detection of cheap but powerful vodka. **80 points**

with P. Sclv(s - This one was a bit syrupy and buttery with some richness and beer notes in the background. Good acidity, enough to take someone's kickball game to the next level. It was powerful enough to kill a small mammal, while tame enough to take your sister on a date.

88 points

Kick in a Box -

Cooler 1- Sweet; open nose is orangey with some Turkish delight character. Off-dry, fat-textured palate with lovely smooth, sweet fruit. It flirts with flabbiness, but gets away with it. If you could drop a few lemons and sharpies into a vat of turpentine, you could recreate this work of beverage art. **81 points**

Cooler 2 - Crisp, tight and complex, this is a really delicious, precise cooler juice with fresh citrusy notes and taut, dense, pure fruit. Balance is the key here: it's a linear, focused style with a hint of fizz that tingles the back of the throat.

Legs, Legs, and Balls Deep-I was a touch scared with this one. It was a decent booze. There were nice lime and leather aromas mingling with some limeade. The mix of hard alcohol and beer is enough to bring Andre the Giant to his knees.




