Reflections on the weekend Scriptures Acts 10:34a, 37–43; Psalm 118; Colossians 3:1–4; John 20:1–9

In John's account, all of us—believers and doubters—are present at the empty tomb. Mary of Magdala instinctively concludes, as the authorities had warned Pilate, that someone has removed Jesus' body. Even for this loving disciple, the empty tomb does not "prove" that Jesus is risen, only that his body is missing. When Peter enters the tomb he sees not Jesus, but only what Jesus left behind: signs of death that are not yet, for Peter, signs of new life. When the beloved disciple enters, "he saw and believed," but not clearly, for the Gospel concludes, "they did not yet understand" (John 20:8, 9).

Thus, in a comforting paradox, Easter morning's Gospel proclaims not Jesus' presence but Jesus' absence; yet despite that absence, belief begins to blossom. What joy for those among us who serenely believe! What comfort for those among us who wrestle with doubt! What peace even for those who rarely worship! Let us recall that continual challenge that we who worship weekly be especially welcoming to visitors who may simply wonder about it all.

Question of the Week

How will I bring the reality of having met the Risen Jesus in word, Eucharist, and others to those who may never have encountered the transforming power of his compassionate love?
