Reflections on the weekend Scriptures

Exodus 17:3-7; Psalm 95; Romans 5:1-2, 5-8; John 4:5-42 or 4:5-15, 19b-26, 39a, 40-42

- •The next three Sundays feature Gospels from John, revealing Jesus as living water to the Samaritan woman, the light of the world to the man born blind, the resurrection and life to Lazarus, and indeed to all those preparing for Baptism or baptismal renewal. In each Gospel, Jesus progressively bestows God's amazing grace on someone, who in turn becomes a source of grace for others, and thus model and paradigm for our own Lenten journey.
- Imaging God's marriage of heaven and earth, Jesus meets a woman at the well where Jacob met Rachel. She has had five husbands and is living with a sixth man, making Jesus the seventh, i.e., biblical perfection. Awakening faith's living water in this Samaritan woman (therefore outside the Law by faith and lifestyle), Jesus guides her from perceiving him simply as another man, "Sir," to "I can see you are a prophet" (John 4:11, 19). When she acknowledges, "I know that the Messiah is coming," Jesus makes the Divine Name his own, declaring, "I AM he" (4:25, 26). Hastening to her fellow townspeople, also Samaritans (outside the Law), she becomes an evangelizer, a conduit of faith's living water, as they acclaim Jesus "truly the savior of the world" (4:42).
- As Moses struck the rock with his staff, may Jesus' cross—abiding instrument of God's unconditional mercy—strike our hardened hearts, unsealing Paul's celebrated flood of God's love "poured out into our hearts through the Holy Spirit" (Romans 5:5). We sinners are thus made channels of faith's living water for other thirsty souls, no matter how "outside the Law" they may seem.

Question of the Week

How will I personally share the journey of our catechumens to the waters of Baptism? Or, if our community has no catechumens, how will I share with one other person my discovery of Christ as "Savior of the world"?
