Reflections on the weekend Scriptures Isaiah 61:1–2a, 10–11; Luke 1, 1 Thessalonians 5:16–24; John 1:6–8, 19–28

If this reading from Isaiah sounds familiar, it may be because we also hear it in Luke. This is the passage that Jesus is given to read in the synagogue, the verses he is referring to when he says, "Today this scripture passage is fulfilled in your hearing" (Luke 4:21). No wonder we hear it now, in anticipation of the celebration of his birth. The prophecy of Isaiah is on the cusp of fulfillment. That good news of gladness, of healing, of liberty, of vindication is here in the person of Jesus.

What is this "year of favor" that Isaiah announces? The year of favor was traditionally the time when debts were cancelled, land was redistributed equitably, and slaves were released. It was an acknowledgment that all the goods of this world, all creation, come from God and that God ultimately has sovereignty over humanity. What implications does this have for us today? What would happen to you and all you own? Obviously, it depends on our status and what we own in the first place. But maybe we should think of it from God's perspective. God cares for each and every one of us. So if any one of us is poor, or brokenhearted, or oppressed, or held captive, it is an affront to God.

Saint Paul's advice to the early Christian community at Thessalonica is good advice for us as well. "Rejoice always," for we have been redeemed by Jesus. "Pray without ceasing," for this is how we can communicate with God. "In all circumstances give thanks," for all that we have has been given to us. "Do not quench the Spirit," for it is the Holy Spirit who builds, energizes, and sanctifies us as we act according to God's will (1 Thessalonians 5:16–19). It is also the Spirit who inspired Isaiah and Paul when they wrote the words we heard today.
